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- 5 (1) As used in this section:
- 6 (a) "Community" means assisted-living community as defined in KRS 194A.700;
- 7 (b) "Health facility" means any institution, place, building, agency, or portion 8 thereof, public or private, whether organized for profit or not, used, 9 operated, or designed to provide medical diagnosis, treatment, nursing, 10 rehabilitative, or preventive care and includes alcohol abuse, drug abuse, 11 and mental health services. "Healthy facility" shall include but shall not be 12 limited to health facilities and health services commonly referred to as hospitals, psychiatric hospitals, physical rehabilitation hospitals, chemical 13 dependency programs, nursing facilities, nursing homes, personal care 14 homes, intermediate care facilities, family care homes, outpatient clinics, 15 16 ambulatory care facilities, ambulatory surgical centers, emergency care 17 centers and services, ambulance providers, hospices, community mental 18 health centers, home health agencies, kidney disease treatment centers and 19 freestanding hemodialysis units, and others providing similarly organized 20 services regardless of nomenclature["Facility" includes long-term care 21 facilities as defined in KRS 216A.010 and residential long-term care facilities 22 as defined in KRS 216.510]; and
- 23 (c) "Mental hospital" means a state-owned or operated mental or psychiatric hospital.
- 25 (2) Notwithstanding any state law to the contrary, the Cabinet for Health and Family Services shall require a community, a *health* facility, and a mental hospital to permit in-person [resident] visitation *with a resident, client, or patient* by at least

8		(a)	Establish procedures for a resident, client, or patient to designate at least one	
9			(1) essential personal care visitor and procedures to change the designated	
10			essential personal care visitor;	
11		(b)	Exempt an essential personal care visitor from any prohibitions on visiting a	
12			resident, client, or patient of a community, a health facility, or a mental	
13			hospital other than the requirements in this subsection including during a	
14			communicable disease outbreak in the community, health facility, or mental	
15			hospital, or due to the communicable disease status of the resident, client,	
16			or patient;	
17		(c)	Require an essential personal care visitor to follow safety protocols of the	
18			community, the <u>health</u> facility, or the mental hospital;	
19		(d)	Require an essential personal care visitor to assume a risk of contracting	
20			communicable diseases, provided the community, the <u>health</u> facility, or the	
21			mental hospital is compliant with the Kentucky Department for Public Health	
22			guidelines;	
23		(e)	Permit a community, a <u>health</u> facility, or a mental hospital to require a written	
24			visitation agreement with an essential personal care visitor;	
25		(f)	Permit a community, <u>health</u> facility, or mental hospital to limit visitation of	
26			an essential personal care visitor to the [resident or ]residents, clients, or	
27			patients he or she is approved to visit;	

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1	(g)	Permit a community, <u>health</u> facility, or mental hospital to limit the total
2		number of essential personal care visitors allowed in the community, health
3		facility, or mental hospital at any one (1) time; and
4	(h)	Except as provided in this section, do not require a community, health
5		facility, or mental hospital to permit an in-person visitor at all times.
6	<b>→</b> S	ection 2. Whereas, the General Assembly recognizes that the mental, physical,
7	and social	well-being of residents, clients, and patients of communities, health facilities,
8	and ment	al hospitals is greatly enhanced by assistance from essential personal care
9	visitors, a	n emergency is declared to exist, and this Act takes effect upon its passage and
10	approval b	by the Governor or upon its otherwise becoming a law.
