9		(c)	"Mental hospital" means a state-owned or operated mental or psychiatric	
10			hospital.	
11	(2)	Noty	withstanding any state law to the contrary, the Cabinet for Health and Family	
12		Serv	rices shall require a community, a facility, and a mental hospital to permit in-	
13		pers	on resident visitation by at least one (1) essential personal care visitor, including	
14		a fa	mily member, legal guardian, outside caregiver, friend, or volunteer who is	
15		impo	ortant to the mental, physical, or social well-being of the resident.	
16	(3)	The	cabinet shall, within fourteen (14) days of the effective date of this Act,	
17		pron	nulgate administrative regulations in accordance with KRS Chapter 13A that,	
18		subject to applicable federal requirements:		
19		(a)	Establish procedures for a resident to designate at least one (1) essential	
20			personal care visitor and procedures to change the designated essential

7		visitation agreement with an essential personal care visitor;
8	(f)	Permit a community, facility, or mental hospital to limit visitation of an
