4	(1)	The	Kentucky Law Enforcement Council shall approve mandatory training subjects		
5		to b	e taught to all students attending a law enforcement basic training course that		
6		inclu	ude but are not limited to:		
7		(a)	Abuse, neglect, and exploitation of the elderly and other crimes against the		
8			elderly, including the use of multidisciplinary teams in the investigation and		
9			prosecution of crimes against the elderly;		
10		(b)	The dynamics of domestic violence, pediatric abusive head trauma, as defined		
11			in KRS 620.020, child physical and sexual abuse, and rape; child		
12			development; the effects of abuse and crime on adult and child victims,		
13			including the impact of abuse and violence on child development; legal		
14			remedies for protection; lethality and risk issues; profiles of offenders and		
15			offender treatment; model protocols for addressing domestic violence, rape,		
16			pediatric abusive head trauma, as defined in KRS 620.020, and child abuse;		
17			available community resources and victim services; and reporting		
18			requirements. This training shall be developed in consultation with legal,		
19			victim services, victim advocacy, and mental health professionals with		
20			expertise in domestic violence, child abuse, and rape. Training in recognizing		
21			pediatric abusive head trauma may be designed in collaboration with		
22			organizations and agencies that specialize in the prevention and recognition of		
23			pediatric abusive head trauma approved by the secretary of the Cabinet for		
24			Health and Family Services;		
25		(c)	Human immunodeficiency virus infection and acquired immunodeficiency

(d) Identification and investigation of, responding to, and reporting bias-related

1			crime, victimization, or intimidation that is a result of or reasonably related to
2			race, color, religion, sex, or national origin;
3		(e)	The characteristics and dynamics of human trafficking, state and federal laws
4			relating to human trafficking, the investigation of cases involving human
5			trafficking, including but not limited to screening for human trafficking, and
6			resources for assistance to the victims of human trafficking;
7		(f)	Beginning January 1, 2017, the council shall require that a law enforcement
8			basic training course include at least eight (8) hours of training relevant to
9			sexual assault; and
10		(g)	Education on female genital mutilation as defined in KRS 508.125, including
11			the risk factors associated with female genital mutilation, the criminal
12			penalties for committing female genital mutilation, and the psychological and
13			health effects on a victim of female genital mutilation.
14	(2)	(a)	The council shall develop and approve mandatory in-service training courses
15			to be presented to all certified peace officers. The council may promulgate
16			administrative regulations in accordance with KRS Chapter 13A setting forth
17			the deadlines by which all certified peace officers shall attend the mandatory
18			in-service training courses.
19		(b)	Beginning January 1, 2017, the council shall establish a forty (40) hour sexual
20			assault investigation training course. After January 1, 2019, agencies shall
21			maintain officers on staff who have completed the forty (40) hour sexual
22			assault investigation training course in accordance with the following:
23			1. Agencies with more than ten (10) but fewer than twenty-one (21) full-
24			time officers shall maintain one (1) officer who has completed the forty
25			(40) hour sexual assault investigation training course;
26			2. Agencies with twenty-one (21) or more but fewer than fifty-one (51)
27			full-time officers shall maintain at least two (2) officers who have

- 1 completed the forty (40) hour sexual assault investigation training 2 course; and 3 3. Agencies with fifty-one (51) or more full-time officers shall maintain at 4 least four (4) officers who have completed the sexual assault 5 investigation course. 6 An agency shall not make an officer directly responsible for the investigation (c) 7 or processing of sexual assault offenses unless that officer has completed the 8 forty (40) hour sexual assault investigation training course. 9 (d) The council may, upon application by any agency, grant an exemption from 10 the training requirements set forth in paragraph (b) of this subsection if that 11 agency, by limitations arising from its scope of authority, does not conduct 12 sexual assault investigations. 13 Any agency failing to comply with paragraph (b) or (c) of this subsection (e) 14 shall, from the date the noncompliance commences, have one (1) year to 15 reestablish the minimum number of trained officers required. 16 (3)The Justice and Public Safety Cabinet shall provide training on the subjects of 17 domestic violence and abuse and may do so utilizing currently available technology. 18 All certified peace officers shall be required to complete this training at least once 19 every two (2) years.
- 20(4)The Justice and Public Safety Cabinet shall provide at least three (3) additional21hours of annual in-service training for peace officer intervention responses when
- 22 <u>encountering persons with mental illnesses, autism spectrum disorders, and other</u>
- 23 neurological and developmental disorders. All officers required to be certified,
- 24who are certified at the request of their employing agency, or who seek25certification upon their own request, under KRS 15.380 shall complete this
- 26 *training at least once every two (2) years.*
- 27 (5) The council shall promulgate administrative regulations in accordance with KRS

1 Chapter 13A to establish mandatory basic training and in-service training courses.
