

1 AN ACT relating to state property and declaring an emergency.

2 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:*

3 ➔SECTION 1. A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 42 IS CREATED TO
4 READ AS FOLLOWS:

5 (1) As used in this section, "State Capitol campus" means the New State Capitol, the
6 State Capitol Annex, the Executive Mansion, and the area surrounding these
7 buildings that is owned by the Commonwealth of Kentucky.

8 (2) The Kentucky State Capitol Campus Commission is created as an independent
9 agency of state government to oversee, control, and manage security protocols for
10 the State Capitol campus. The commission shall be attached to the Finance and
11 Administration Cabinet for administrative purposes.

12 (3) The commission shall consist of the following eleven (11) members:

13 (a) The ex officio members of the commission shall be as follows:

14 1. The secretary of the Finance and Administration Cabinet or his or her
15 designee;

16 2. The Governor's chief of staff or his or her designee;

17 3. The Chief Justice of the Supreme Court or his or her designee;

18 4. The Secretary of State or his or her designee;

19 5. The Attorney General or his or her designee; and

20 6. The commissioner of the Department of Kentucky State Police or his
21 or her designee; and

22 (b) In addition to the ex officio members of the commission, the following
23 members shall be appointed:

24 1. Two (2) former members of the Senate, appointed by the President of
25 the Senate, who shall not be members of the same political party;

26 2. Two (2) former members of the House of Representatives, appointed
27 by the Speaker of the House of Representatives, who shall not be

- 1 members of the same political party; and
- 2 3. One (1) representative of the public-at-large appointed jointly by the
- 3 Speaker of the House of Representatives and the President of the
- 4 Senate.
- 5 (4) (a) The terms of office of each member appointed pursuant to subsection (3)(b)
- 6 of this section shall be for three (3) years, and they shall hold office from
- 7 the date of the member's appointment until the end of the term for which
- 8 the member was appointed. Elected members shall be a member of the
- 9 commission so long as they remain in office.
- 10 (b) In the case of a vacancy occurring on the commission, the President of the
- 11 Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, or both, as the case
- 12 may be, shall in the same manner prescribed for the regular appointment to
- 13 the commission, fill the vacancy by appointing a member. Any member
- 14 appointed to fill a vacancy occurring prior to the expiration of the term for
- 15 which the member's predecessor was appointed shall hold office for the
- 16 remainder of the term.
- 17 (5) The commission shall elect one (1) member of the commission to serve as its
- 18 chair and a second member to serve as vice chair with authority to act in the
- 19 absence of the chair. A majority of the members of the commission shall
- 20 constitute a quorum for the transaction of its business or exercise of its powers.
- 21 (6) The commission shall:
- 22 (a) Approve all security protocols planned, developed, and implemented by the
- 23 Department of Kentucky State Police for the State Capitol campus;
- 24 (b) Commission a security inspection of the State Capitol campus by either the
- 25 Department of Kentucky State Police or a contract obtained under KRS
- 26 Chapter 45A whenever a security inspection is deemed necessary by the
- 27 commission. The cost of the inspection, if any, shall be deemed a necessary

- 1 and governmental expense;
- 2 (c) Approve administrative regulations promulgated by the Finance and
- 3 Administration Cabinet under KRS Chapter 13A for the use of the State
- 4 Capitol campus prior to filing with the Legislative Research Commission;
- 5 (d) Approve administrative regulations promulgated by the Department of
- 6 Kentucky State Police under KRS Chapter 13A for the security of the State
- 7 Capitol campus prior to filing with the Legislative Research Commission;
- 8 and
- 9 (e) Seek funding sources such as line item appropriations and federal grants
- 10 for security protocols planned, developed, and implemented by the
- 11 commission in coordination with the Department of Kentucky State Police.

12 ➔Section 2. KRS 16.065 is amended to read as follows:

13 In addition to the performance of all duties relating to the Department of Kentucky State

14 Police, the department shall perform the following functions:

- 15 (1) Security of state facilities located in Frankfort;
- 16 (2) Highway enforcement;
- 17 (3) Water safety enforcement as provided in KRS Chapter 235;~~and~~
- 18 (4) Personal protection of a Medal of Honor recipient who:
- 19 (a) Is a current Kentucky resident;
- 20 (b) Is attending any public event or ceremony occurring within the
- 21 Commonwealth of Kentucky, to which he or she has received an official
- 22 written invitation;
- 23 (c) Is representing for no reason other than being a recipient of the Medal of
- 24 Honor; and
- 25 (d) Has requested protection, in writing and with a copy of the official invitation,
- 26 to the department no less than fourteen (14) days prior to the event;
- 27 not to exceed six (6) instances of protection per year; and

1 (5) After approval by the Kentucky State Capitol Campus Commission, provide
2 planning for and implementation of security protocols for the State Capitol
3 campus as defined in Section 1 of this Act.

4 ➔Section 3. KRS 16.080 is amended to read as follows:

5 (1) The commissioner shall promulgate administrative regulations under KRS Chapter
6 13A for the enlistment, training, code of ethics, discipline, and conduct of officers
7 of the department and individuals employed as a Trooper R Class or CVE R Class,
8 and the commissioner may promulgate administrative regulations for the governing
9 and operation of the department as appear to him or her reasonably necessary to
10 carry out the provisions of KRS 16.010 to 16.170.

11 (2) The commissioner shall promulgate administrative regulations under KRS
12 Chapter 13A that outline the security protocols for the State Capitol campus as
13 defined in Section 1 of this Act. Prior to filing the administrative regulations with
14 the Legislative Research Commission, the commissioner shall obtain the
15 approval of the Kentucky State Capitol Campus Commission. The Kentucky State
16 Capitol Campus Commission may require the commissioner to use information
17 obtained from security inspections performed for the Kentucky State Capitol
18 Campus Commission in promulgating the administrative regulations.

19 (3) The commissioner may require any officer, individual employed as a Trooper R
20 Class or CVE R Class, or civilian who receives or disburses public funds in the
21 course of his or her duties to file a bond, conditioned that he or she will honestly,
22 correctly, and according to law, receive, disburse, and account for all public moneys
23 coming into his or her hands. The commissioner, each officer, and each individual
24 employed as a Trooper R Class or CVE R Class, shall execute a bond to the
25 Commonwealth of Kentucky in the sum of not less than two thousand dollars
26 (\$2,000), conditioned upon the faithful discharge of his or her duties. The premium
27 on the bonds shall be paid by the department. The commissioner, each officer of the

1 department, and each individual employed as a Trooper R Class or CVE R Class
2 shall, before entering upon the discharge of their official duties, take the
3 constitutional oath of office.

4 ~~(4)~~~~(3)~~ Subject to the provisions of KRS 56.440 to 56.550, the commissioner, with
5 the approval of the Governor and the secretary of the Finance and Administration
6 Cabinet, may acquire real estate or interests therein, by purchase, lease, or
7 otherwise, necessary for the purposes of the department, and, with like approval,
8 provide for the acquisition or construction of necessary buildings and other
9 permanent structures and facilities. Title to any real estate acquired shall be taken in
10 the name of the Commonwealth.

11 ➔Section 4. KRS 56.463 is amended to read as follows:

12 The cabinet shall have the power and duty:

- 13 (1) To determine the comparative needs and demands of the various state agencies for
14 acquiring real estate and for building projects;
- 15 (2) To purchase or otherwise acquire all real property determined to be needed for state
16 use and upon the approval of the secretary of the Finance and Administration
17 Cabinet as to the determination of need and as to the action of purchase or other
18 acquisition, except as provided in KRS Chapters 175, 176, 177, and 180. All such
19 acquisitions of real property or interests therein shall be made in accordance with
20 KRS 45A.045;
- 21 (3) To sell or otherwise dispose of all property, including any interest in real property,
22 of the state that is not needed or has become unsuitable for public use or would be
23 more suitable consistent with the public interest for some other use as determined
24 by the secretary of the Finance and Administration Cabinet. All such sales or other
25 disposition shall be made in accordance with KRS 45A.045;
- 26 (4) (a) **Subject to the provisions of paragraph (e) of this subsection,** to control the
27 use of any real property owned or otherwise held by the Commonwealth, or

1 any state agency, and to determine for what periods of time and for what
2 purposes any state agency may use the same, including the agency for whose
3 use it was initially acquired or improved, and to determine what appropriate
4 uses shall be made of such real property during periods that the cabinet finds
5 the same is not required for the purposes of any particular state agency. The
6 cabinet shall allocate to the General Assembly and the Legislative Research
7 Commission the amount of space within the New State Capitol Annex,
8 currently assigned to the legislative branch in the basement and on the first
9 floor totaling forty-nine thousand six hundred thirty-eight (49,638) square
10 feet; approximately twenty-four thousand four hundred fifty-two (24,452)
11 square feet on the second floor from an imaginary line running north and
12 south down the center of the center wing hallway of the building and all space
13 to the east of this line, excluding mechanical areas, public entrances, and
14 restrooms; approximately twenty-three thousand nine hundred forty (23,940)
15 square feet on the third floor from an imaginary line running north and south
16 down the center of the center wing hallway of the building and all space to the
17 east of this line, excluding mechanical areas, public entrances, and restrooms;
18 approximately twenty-two thousand fifty-six (22,056) square feet on the
19 fourth floor from an imaginary line running north and south down the center
20 of the center wing hallway of the building and all space to the east of this line,
21 excluding mechanical areas, public entrances, and restrooms. All space
22 assigned to the legislative branch and plans, uses, furnishings, and equipment
23 therefor are subject to the specific approval of the Legislative Research
24 Commission;

- 25 (b) All additional space in the New State Capitol Annex, not specifically allocated
26 for use by the General Assembly and the Legislative Research Commission in
27 paragraph (a) of this subsection, shall be allocated for the use of the legislative

1 branch, with occupancy by the legislative branch to be determined by the
2 Legislative Research Commission. Until the Legislative Research
3 Commission, by vote of a majority of its entire membership, determines that
4 the legislative branch shall occupy all or part of such additional space in the
5 Capitol Annex, the cabinet shall continue to determine the occupancy of such
6 additional space;

7 (c) Forty percent (40%) of the floor space provided by paragraph (a) of this
8 subsection for use by the legislative branch shall be assigned for the use of the
9 Senate. Sixty percent (60%) of the floor space provided by paragraph (a) of
10 this subsection for use by the legislative branch shall be assigned for the use
11 of the House of Representatives;~~and~~

12 (d) To determine the housing and furnishings needs of the various state agencies
13 located in Frankfort and to establish and put into effect a permanent program
14 for housing them. Subject to paragraphs (a) and (b) of this subsection, the
15 cabinet is also authorized and directed to allocate office space and furnishings
16 in existing public buildings located in Frankfort, exclusive of the third and
17 fourth floors of the New State Capitol and the space in the New State Capitol
18 Annex allocated to the legislative branch, according to the needs of the
19 various agencies. When necessary, the cabinet is authorized to provide
20 additional office space and furnishings in Frankfort under any building
21 program the cabinet deems most advisable and economical for the state. The
22 permanent housing program shall include provisions for housing the General
23 Assembly and its related agencies, including the Legislative Research
24 Commission, and its subcommittees, the executive offices, the Supreme Court
25 and the clerk of the Supreme Court, the Department of Law and the law
26 library, in the New State Capitol, provided the General Assembly and the
27 Legislative Research Commission shall have complete control and exclusive

1 use of the third and fourth floors of the New State Capitol and shall have
2 exclusive use of the space in the New State Capitol Annex allocated to them
3 under paragraphs (a) and (b) of this subsection. If there be any additional
4 space in the Capitol, it shall be assigned to agencies whose activities are most
5 closely related to the agencies directed to be located permanently in the
6 Capitol; and

7 (e) Administrative regulations promulgated by the cabinet under KRS Chapter
8 13A relating to the use of the State Capitol campus as defined in Section 1
9 of this Act shall be approved by the Kentucky State Capitol Campus
10 Commission prior to filing with the Legislative Research Commission;

11 (5) To acquire, by condemnation in the manner provided in the Eminent Domain Act of
12 Kentucky, any real estate necessary for use by the state or by any state agency, when
13 the cabinet is unable to agree with the owner thereof on a price for such real estate;

14 (6) To lease any real property, or any interest in such real property, owned by the state
15 or any agency thereof, in accordance with KRS 45A.045;

16 (7) To provide for and adopt plans and specifications as may be necessary, to provide
17 adequate public notice for and receive bids for any expenditures proposed to be
18 made, to award contracts for the purpose authorized, to supervise construction and
19 make changes and revisions in plans and specifications or in construction as may
20 become necessary, and generally to do any and all other things as may become
21 necessary or expedient in order to effectively fulfill and carry out the purposes of
22 this chapter, including the right to employ clerks, engineers, statisticians, architects,
23 or other persons required to be employed in order to fulfill the functions of the
24 Commonwealth relating to state property and buildings provided in KRS 56.450 to
25 56.550; and

26 (8) To adopt rules and promulgate administrative regulations as may be necessary to
27 govern the acquisition, control, and disposition of the real property to which this

1 section is applicable.

2 ➔Section 5. KRS 12.020 is amended to read as follows:

3 Departments, program cabinets and their departments, and the respective major
4 administrative bodies that they include are enumerated in this section. It is not intended
5 that this enumeration of administrative bodies be all-inclusive. Every authority, board,
6 bureau, interstate compact, commission, committee, conference, council, office, or any
7 other form of organization shall be included in or attached to the department or program
8 cabinet in which they are included or to which they are attached by statute or statutorily
9 authorized executive order; except in the case of the Personnel Board and where the
10 attached department or administrative body is headed by a constitutionally elected officer,
11 the attachment shall be solely for the purpose of dissemination of information and
12 coordination of activities and shall not include any authority over the functions,
13 personnel, funds, equipment, facilities, or records of the department or administrative
14 body.

24 ➔Section 6. The Kentucky State Capitol Campus Commission fund is hereby

1 ➔Section 7. Whereas, the safety and security of the Capitol Campus and its

4 its passage and approval by the Governor or upon its otherwise becoming law.
