

1 AN ACT relating to the Kentucky Law Enforcement Council.

2 ***Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:***

3 ➔Section 1. KRS 15.315 is amended to read as follows:

4 The Kentucky Law Enforcement Council is hereby established as an independent
5 administrative body of state government to be made up as follows:

- 6 (1) The Attorney General of Kentucky, the commissioner of the Department of
7 Kentucky State Police, the commissioner of the Department of Criminal Justice
8 Training, the chief of police of the Louisville Metro Police Department, the chief of
9 police of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Division of Police, ***the chief of***
10 ***police of the Bowling Green Police Department,*** the director of the Southern
11 Police Institute of the University of Louisville, the dean of the College of Justice
12 and Safety of Eastern Kentucky University, the president of the Kentucky Peace
13 Officers Association, the president of the Kentucky Association of Chiefs of Police,
14 the Kentucky president of the Fraternal Order of Police, the president of the
15 Kentucky Women's Law Enforcement Network, and the president of the Kentucky
16 Sheriffs' Association shall be ex officio members of the council, as full voting
17 members of the council by reason of their office. The United States attorneys for the
18 Eastern and Western Districts of Kentucky may confer and designate a local law
19 enforcement liaison who shall serve on the council in an advisory capacity only
20 without voting privileges. Each ex officio member may designate in writing a
21 person to represent him or her and to vote on his or her behalf. Designees of the
22 Department of Kentucky State Police, Department of Criminal Justice Training,
23 Louisville Metro Police Department, ***Bowling Green Police Department,*** and the
24 Lexington-Fayette Urban County Division of Police shall be the head of the
25 agency's training division or the agency's deputy chief or deputy commissioner.
- 26 (2) Twelve (12) members shall be appointed by the Governor for terms of four (4) years
27 from the following classifications: a city manager or mayor, a county

1 judge/executive, three (3) Kentucky sheriffs, a member of the Kentucky State Bar
2 Association, five (5) chiefs of police, and a citizen of Kentucky not coming within
3 the foregoing classifications. No person shall serve beyond the time he or she holds
4 the office or employment by reason of which he or she was initially eligible for
5 appointment. Vacancies shall be filled in the same manner as the original
6 appointment and the successor shall be appointed for the unexpired term. Any
7 member may be appointed for additional terms.

8 (3) No member may serve on the council with the dual membership as the
9 representative of more than one (1) of the aforementioned groups or the holder of
10 more than one (1) of the aforementioned positions. In the event that an existing
11 member of the council assumes a position entitling him to serve on the council in
12 another capacity, the Governor shall appoint an additional member from the group
13 concerned to prevent dual membership.

14 (4) Membership on the council does not constitute a public office, and no member shall
15 be disqualified from holding public office by reason of his membership.

16 ➔Section 2. KRS 15.320 is amended to read as follows:

17 The business of the council shall be conducted in the following manner:

18 (1) The council at its initial meeting to be held promptly after the appointment of its
19 members, shall elect a chairman and vice chairman from among its members who
20 shall serve until the first meeting in the succeeding year. Thereafter, the chairman
21 and vice chairman shall be elected at the first meeting of each calendar year.

22 (2) **A majority of the**~~Ten (10)~~ members of the council shall constitute a quorum for
23 the transaction of business.

24 (3) The council shall maintain minutes of its meetings and such other records as it
25 deems necessary.

26 (4) The council shall report at least annually to the Governor and to the General
27 Assembly as to its activities.
