A RESOLUTION urging the Lexington Center Corporation to not remove cash as a
 payment option.

- WHEREAS, paper money and metal coins have been the accepted currency of the
  United States since long before its actual founding; and
- 5 WHEREAS, the United States Mint produced billions of coins in 2021, and the 6 United States Bureau of Engraving and Printing has over two trillion dollars' worth of 7 Federal Reserve notes in circulation at present; and
- 8 WHEREAS, cash as a medium of transaction is available to all consumers, to the 9 wealthy and to those of modest means, in fair weather and foul, and during periods with 10 and without electricity for powering electronic devices; and
- WHEREAS, while cashless, digital payment options are gaining popularity, there are still consumers who, perhaps by deliberate choice, lack of familiarity with digital mediums, or even those with limited access to wired or wireless communications, may still prefer to use United States currency as a means of payment; and
- WHEREAS, on March 2nd, 2022, the Central Bank Convention Center, Rupp
  Arena, and the Lexington Opera House will no longer accept cash for parking and
  concessions; and

WHEREAS, while the concept of cashless transactions has unarguable advantages, to no longer accept cash for parking and concessions has the distinct potential to greatly diminish the experience of spectators enjoying such events as Kentucky Wildcats Basketball games, the Kentucky High School Athletic Association's Sweet Sixteen tournaments, or world-class theater productions;
