1	A RESOLUTION affirming support for Ukrainian sovereignty, the people of
2	Ukraine, and their right to self-determination.
3	WHEREAS, the people of Ukraine and Kentucky have a shared love of freedom,
4	independence, self-determination, and self-governance; and
5	WHEREAS, the 43.7 million people of Ukraine share an identity which is distinct
6	and separate from Russia, and approximately 78 percent of the Ukrainian population
7	identify as Ukrainian, while only 17 percent of people in Ukraine identify as Russian; and
8	WHEREAS, the language, culture, and history of Ukraine is rich and distinct from
9	Russian language, culture, and history; and
10	WHEREAS, Ukraine first declared independence from Bolshevik communists in
11	Russia in 1918; and
12	WHEREAS, Ukraine has enjoyed self-governance since its separation from the
13	Soviet Union in August 1991, and Ukraine ratified its most recent constitution in June
14	1996; and
15	WHEREAS, Ukraine is recognized as a democratic republic and is governed by
16	President Volodymyr Zelenskyy and Prime Minister Denys Shmyhal; and
17	WHEREAS, the economies of both Ukraine and Kentucky are driven by their
18	abundance of natural resources; and
19	WHEREAS, the arable land in Ukraine is significantly larger than that in Russia,
20	and should be used and enjoyed by the people of Ukraine, not exploited by the Russian
21	government to expand its own power; and
22	WHEREAS, persistent Russian interference and aggression weaken Ukrainian
23	growth and investments; and
24	WHEREAS, Ukraine is the largest Eastern European country, making the retention
25	of its independence from Russia a security interest of the United States and NATO; and
26	WHEREAS, a threat to the sovereign borders of Ukraine is a threat to all western
27	democracies; and

1	WHEREAS, President Vladimir Putin is an unstable, unpredictable threat to
2	Europe, NATO, and its allies;
3	NOW, THEREFORE,
4	Be it resolved by the Senate of the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of
5	Kentucky:

6 →Section 1. The Kentucky State Senate stands in solidarity with the people of
7 Ukraine in their fight against Russian oppression, aggression, and annexation.

8 → Section 2. When the Senate adjourns this day, it does so in honor and utmost
9 commendation of the Ukrainian people and their right to self-determination and self10 governance.

11 → Section 3. The Clerk of the Senate is directed to transmit a copy of this
