On page 1 deleting lines 5 through 20 and inserting the following:

"(1) As used in this section:

- (a) "Automated license plate reader" or "ALPR" means a system of one (1) or more

 mobile or fixed high-speed cameras combined with computer algorithms to convert

 images of license plates into data that is readable by a computer system; and
- (b) "Entity" means any law enforcement agency, unit of local government, school or university, homeowner's association, company, or individual that deploys and maintains ALPRs.
- (2) An ALPR may only be deployed and maintained by:
 - (a) An entity for the sole purpose of protecting public safety, conducting criminal investigations, or ensuring compliance with local, state, or federal law; or
 - (b) The Kentucky Transportation Cabinet for the sole purpose of toll collection activities on highways and bridges.
- (3) License plate data captured by an ALPR shall not be retained for more than ninety (90) days, except when the data is captured by:
 - (a) An entity and is being used as evidence in a criminal prosecution or administrative investigation; or
 - (b) The Kentucky Transportation Cabinet and is being used for toll collection activities
