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1		AN ACT relating to the Commonwealth Education Continuum.
2	Be i	t enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:
3		→SECTION 1. A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 164 IS CREATED TO
4	REA	AD AS FOLLOWS:
5	<u>(1)</u>	The Commonwealth Education Continuum is hereby created to encourage and
6		support collaboration, information sharing, and a shared vision for increasing
7		educational opportunity and achievement at all levels of Kentucky's education
8		system, prekindergarten through postsecondary education, to increase students'
9		access to degrees and credentials that lead to sustainable, competitive-wage
10		<u>careers.</u>
11	(2)	The continuum shall serve as a statewide coordinating body to study and make
12		recommendations concerning education at all levels to avoid fragmentation of
13		policies, promote improved teaching, and ensure a more integrated, seamless
14		education system that enables children to enter school ready to learn, receive
15		challenging instruction throughout their school careers, graduate from high
16		school ready for college or work, and continue their education in a way that
17		makes them productive and successful citizens.
18	<u>(3)</u>	The continuum shall consist of twenty-nine (29) members. The continuum shall
19		be composed of the following members:
20		(a) The president or designee of the Council on Postsecondary Education, who
21		<u>shall be co-chair;</u>
22		(b) The commissioner or designee of the Department of Education, who shall
23		<u>be co-chair;</u>
24		(c) The secretary or designee of the Education and Labor Cabinet, who shall be
25		<u>co-chair;</u>
26		(d) The President of the Senate or designee;
27		(e) The Speaker of the House of Representatives or designee;

1	(f) The president or designee of the Association of Independent Kentucky
2	Colleges and Universities;
3	(g) The executive director or designee of the Kentucky Higher Education
4	Assistance Authority;
5	(h) The executive director or designee of the Governor's Office of Early
6	<u>Childhood;</u>
7	(i) The president or designee of the Kentucky Chamber of Commerce;
8	(i) The executive director or designee of Kentucky Skills U;
9	(k) The associate commissioner or designee of the Department of Education
10	Office of Career and Technical Education;
11	(1) The president or designee of the Kentucky Community and Technical
12	<u>College System;</u>
13	(m) The executive director or designee of the Kentucky Center for Statistics;
14	(n) The executive director or designee of the Kentucky Commission on Military
15	<u>Affairs;</u>
16	(o) The associate commissioner or designee of the Department of Education
17	Office of Educator Licensure and Effectiveness;
18	(p) A representative of public four (4) year institutions of higher education who
19	shall be appointed by the Advisory Conference of Presidents established in
20	<u>KRS 164.021;</u>
21	(q) A representative of the Council on Postsecondary Education which shall be
22	appointed by the council chair;
23	(r) A representative who shall be appointed by the Governor from one (1) list of
24	three (3) names submitted by the Board of Student Body Presidents
25	established in KRS 164.0211 representing enrolled postsecondary students;
26	(s) A representative of the Kentucky Board of Education who shall be
27	appointed by the board chair;

1	(t) A representative who shall be appointed by the Governor from one (1) list of
2	three (3) names submitted by the Kentucky School Counselor Association;
3	(u) A representative of kindergarten through twelfth grade students who shall
4	be appointed by the Governor from one (1) list of three (3) names submitted
5	by the Commissioner's Student Advisory Council;
6	(v) A representative of the Kentucky Workforce Innovation Board who shall be
7	appointed by the board chair;
8	(w) A representative of kindergarten through twelfth grade parents who shall be
9	appointed by the Governor from one (1) list of three (3) names submitted by
10	the Kentucky Parent Teacher Association;
11	(x) A representative who shall be appointed by the Governor from one (1) list of
12	three (3) names submitted by the Kentucky School Boards Association;
13	(y) A representative who shall be appointed by the Governor from one (1) list of
14	three (3) names submitted by the Kentucky Association of School
15	Administrators;
16	(z) A representative who shall be appointed by the Governor from one (1) list of $A$
17	three (3) names submitted by the Kentucky Association of School
18	<u>Superintendents;</u>
19	(aa) A representative of educator preparation programs who shall be appointed
20	by the Governor from one (1) list of three (3) names submitted by the
21	Kentucky Association of Colleges for Teacher Education;
22	(ab) A representative of kindergarten through twelfth grade teachers who shall
23	be appointed by the Governor from one (1) list of three (3) names submitted
24	by the Kentucky Education Association; and
25	(ac) A representative of public four (4) year institutions of higher education
26	advisors who shall be appointed by the Advisory Conference of Presidents
27	established in KRS 164.021.

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1	<u>(4)</u>	A majority of the full membership shall constitute a quorum.
2	<u>(5)</u>	Each member of the continuum, other than members who serve by virtue of their
3		positions, shall serve for a term of three (3) years or until a successor is appointed
4		and qualified, except for the initial appointments which shall be:
5		(a) For a term of one (1) year for members appointed under subsection (3)(p) to
6		(s) of this section;
7		(b) For a term of two (2) years for members appointed under subsection (3)(t)
8		to (x) of this section; and
9		(c) For a term of three (3) years for members appointed under subsection $(3)(y)$
10		to (ac) of this section.
11	<u>(6)</u>	If a vacancy occurs within the continuum during its duration, the vacancy shall
12		be filled for the remainder of the term in the same manner as described in
13		subsection (3) of this section.
14	<u>(7)</u>	The continuum shall be attached to the Council on Postsecondary Education for
15		administrative purposes. With advice from the continuum co-chairs, the president
16		of the council may contract with state or national education professionals to
17		provide support to the continuum. The council shall provide office space and
18		other resources necessary to support the staff and work of the continuum.
19	<u>(8)</u>	The continuum, under the leadership of the co-chairs, may organize itself into
20		appropriate workgroups or subcommittees to accomplish its purpose and may
21		include but is not limited to topics that focus on:
22		(a) Evidence-based instruction of foundational skills in mathematics, reading,
23		and writing;
24		(b) Academic readiness and assessments;
25		(c) Career advising, education, exploration, and experience;
26		(d) Early postsecondary opportunities; and
27		(e) Teacher workforce recruitment and retention.

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1	<b>(9</b> )	Members of the continuum shall serve without compensation but, contingent
2		upon funding, shall be reimbursed for necessary travel and expenses while
3		attending meetings at the same per diem rate promulgated in administrative
4		regulation for state employees under the provisions of KRS Chapter 45.
5	<u>(10)</u>	The continuum shall submit to the Interim Joint Committee on Education:
6		(a) Legislative and budgetary recommendations no later than October 30 of
7		each year; and
8		(b) An annual report no later than June 1 of each year.
9	<u>(11)</u>	The continuum shall have ongoing responsibility for providing advice and
10		guidance to policymakers in the development of statewide policies and in the
11		identification and allocation of resources to improve statewide education
12		outcomes.
