

1 AN ACT relating to voter registration.

2 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:*

3 ➔SECTION 1. A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 116 IS CREATED TO  
4 READ AS FOLLOWS:

5 *(1) The Secretary of State shall issue a comprehensive status report regarding voter*  
6 *registration records cleanup activities on a quarterly basis to the appropriate*  
7 *committee of the General Assembly and shall also make the report available to*  
8 *the public via electronic means.*

9 *(2) The report shall be sorted by county and shall contain every address in each*  
10 *county that lists a registered voter and the number of voters registered at that*  
11 *address. Any personal identifying information shall be redacted.*

12 *(3) The report shall include:*

13 *(a) Any activities to resolve obvious anomalies per address, such as a high*  
14 *number of people living at a single-family home address, voters registered at*  
15 *a commercial location, or voters registered at an address that is a vacant lot;*

16 *(b) Incidents of multiple people registered at the same address with the same*  
17 *age that have minor variations in the spelling of the name and the status of*  
18 *the resolution of those duplicates;*

19 *(c) The quantity and quality of voter registration records cleanup activities,*  
20 *which shall include comparisons to other state and federal records by*  
21 *address, such as operator's license renewal records, state and federal*  
22 *benefit recipient records, Social Security records, and the National Change*  
23 *of Address database maintained by the United States Postal Service;*

24 *(d) The number of voter eligibility changes, which shall include relocation out*  
25 *of state, death, incarceration, expungement, and citizenship status changes;*

26 *(e) The use of any national voter registration clearinghouse system; however,*  
27 *any such relationship may not impose, by contract or agreement, any duties*

1           upon the Commonwealth of Kentucky or the Secretary of State for any  
2           activities beyond identifying and removing inaccurate or fraudulent voter  
3           registrations; and  
4           (f) The number of people added and removed from the voter registration  
5           records which shall be broken down by party registration and county.  
6           (4) Citizens of each county shall have in-person access to the report at the county  
7           clerk's office, as well as online access via the Secretary of State's website, to  
8           verify that his or her address is not being used fraudulently by other registered  
9           voters as the address of record. Any discrepancies may be reported to the  
10           Secretary of State and to the appropriate county clerk for correction.
