1		AN	ACT relating to the Commission on Race and Access to Opportunity.		
2 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:					
3		⇒s	ection 1. KRS 7.200 is amended to read as follows:		
4	(1)	The	Commission on Race and Access to Opportunity is hereby established within		
5		the	legislative department of state government. The purpose of the commission		
6		shal	l be to conduct studies and research on issues where disparities may exist across		
7		the	sectors of educational equity, child welfare, health, economic opportunity,		
8		juve	nile justice, criminal justice, and any other sectors that are deemed relevant in		
9		an e	ffort to identify areas of improvement in providing services and opportunities		
10		for r	ninority communities.		
11	(2)	The	commission shall be composed of the following thirteen (13) members:		
12		(a)	One (1) member appointed by the President of the Senate and the Speaker of		
13			the House of Representatives from a list of three (3) names provided by the		
14			Prosecutors Advisory Council;		
15		(b)	Four (4) members of the Senate, two (2) of whom shall be appointed by the		
16			Senate President, and two (2) of whom shall be appointed by the Senate		
17			Minority Floor Leader;		
18		(c)	Four (4) members of the House of Representatives, two (2) of whom shall be		
19			appointed by the Speaker of the House, and two (2) of whom shall be		
20			appointed by the House Minority Floor Leader; and		
21		(d)	Four (4) members from the private and nonprofit sectors, universities, or local		
22			governments who have expertise in social policy related to education, health,		
23			economic development, or the law and who shall be appointed for up to two		
24			(2) consecutive, three (3) year terms by the following:		
25			1. One (1) shall be appointed by the Senate President;		
26			2. One (1) shall be appointed by the Senate Minority Floor Leader;		
27			3. One (1) shall be appointed by the Speaker of the House; and		

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1		4. One (1) shall be appointed by the House Minority Floor Leader.
2	(3) The	President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House shall each appoint one (1)
3	CO-0	chair of the commission from among that chamber's members appointed to the
4	con	nmission.
5	(4) Any	vacancy which may occur in the membership of the commission shall be filled
6	by t	he appointing authority who made the original appointment.
7	<u>(5) Me</u>	mbers described in subsection (2)(d) of this section who fail to attend fifty
8	per	cent (50%) of commission meetings in a calendar year may be recommended
9	<u>to ti</u>	he appointing authority for replacement with new members.
10	<u>(6) For</u>	any appointment or reappointment of members under this section, the
11	app	ointing authority shall forward a notice of appointment or reappointment to
12	<u>the</u>	commission and the Legislative Research Commission.
13	<u>(7)<del>[(</del>5)]</u>	The commission shall have the authority to:
14	(a)	Hold monthly meetings during the interim meeting period of the General
15		Assembly;
16	(b)	Seek comment, testimony, documents, records, or other information from
17		various government agencies and organizations representing the public to
18		address existing and potential barriers to minority success and empowerment;
19		and
20	(c)	Provide research-driven policy proposals and actionable items when areas of
21		improvement are identified.
22	<u>(8)[(6)]</u>	A majority of the entire membership of the commission shall constitute a
23	quo	rum.
24	<u>(9)</u> [(7)]	The Legislative Research Commission shall have exclusive jurisdiction over
25	the	employment of personnel necessary to carry out the provisions of this section.
26	<u>(10)</u> [(8)]	The commission shall publish and submit an annual report to the Legislative
27	Res	earch Commission with recommendations on any potential legislative or

1 administrative actions with respect to their findings.
