1	AN ACT relating to public contracts.
2	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:
3	→SECTION 1. A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 45A IS CREATED TO
4	READ AS FOLLOWS:
5	(1) As used in this section:
6	(a) ''Ammunition'' means a loaded cartridge case, primer, bullet, or propellant
7	powder with or without a projectile;
8	(b) "Firearm" means a weapon that expels a projectile by the action of
9	explosive or expanding gases;
10	(c) "Firearm accessory" means:
11	1. A device specifically designed or adapted to enable an individual to
12	wear, carry, store, or mount a firearm on the individual or on a
13	conveyance; or
14	2. An item used in conjunction with or mounted on a firearm that is not
15	essential to the basic function of the firearm, including a detachable
16	firearm magazine;
17	(d) "Firearm entity" means a:
18	1. Manufacturer, distributor, wholesaler, supplier, or retailer of
19	firearms, firearm accessories, or ammunition; or
20	2. Business establishment, private club, or association that operates an
21	area for the discharge or other use of firearms for silhouette, skeet,
22	trap, black powder, target, self-defense, or similar recreational
23	shooting at which not fewer than twenty (20) different individuals
24	discharge firearms each calendar year; and
25	(e) "Firearm trade association" means any person, corporation,
26	unincorporated association, federation, business league, or business
27	organization that:

1		1. Is not organized or operated for profit and for which hone of its net
2		earnings inure to the benefit of any private shareholder or individual;
3		2. Has two (2) or more firearm entities as members; and
4		3. Is exempt from federal income taxation pursuant to 26 U.S.C. sec.
5		501(a) as an organization described by 26 U.S.C. sec. 501(c)(6).
6	(2) (a)	A governmental body shall not enter into a contract for the purchase of
7		goods or services unless the contract contains a written verification from the
8		company selling the goods or services that the company:
9		1. Does not have a practice, policy, guidance, or directive that
10		discriminates against a firearm entity or firearm trade association
11		based solely on its status as a firearm entity or firearm trade
12		association; and
13		2. Will not discriminate against a firearm entity or firearm trade
14		association during the term of the contract based solely on the entity's
15		or association's status as a firearm entity or firearm trade association.
16	<u>(b)</u>	A company discriminates against a firearm entity or firearm trade
17		association when it:
18		1. Refuses to engage in the trade of any goods or services with the entity
19		or association based solely on its status as a firearm entity or firearm
20		trade association;
21		2. Refrains from continuing an existing business relationship with the
22		entity or association based solely on its status as a firearm entity or
23		firearm trade association; or
24		3. Terminates an existing business relationship with the entity or
25		association based solely on its status as a firearm entity or firearm
26		trade association.
27	(c)	A company does not discriminate against a firearm entity or firearm trade

1		association when it refuses to engage in the trade of any goods or services,
2		refrains from continuing an existing business relationship, or declines to
3		enter into, modifies, or terminates an existing business relationship:
4		1. To comply with federal, state, or local law, policy, or regulation, or a
5		directive from a regulator; or
6		2. For any traditional business reason that is specific to the customer or
7		potential customer and not based solely on an entity's or association's
8		status as a firearm entity or firearm trade association.
9		(d) The restrictions and obligations in this subsection shall not apply to:
10		1. Sole proprietorships;
11		2. Contracts with sole source providers; or
12		3. Public entities that do not receive any bids from companies that are
13		able to provide the written verification required by this section.
14	<u>(3)</u>	The provisions in subsection (2) of this section shall apply to any contract with a
15		value of one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) or more that is:
16		(a) To be paid partially or wholly from public funds;
17		(b) Between a public entity and a company with at least ten (10) full-time
18		employees; and
19		(c) Entered into on or after the effective date of this Act.
20	<u>(4)</u>	Nothing in this section shall be construed to require a company that is a
21		merchant, retail seller, or platform to sell or list for sale ammunition, firearms, or
22		firearm accessories.
23	<u>(5)</u>	The Attorney General shall enforce the provisions of this section and investigate
24		any violations or alleged violations of this section.
