1		AN ACT relating to universal recognition of occupational licenses.
2	Be it	t enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:
3		→ SECTION 1. A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 335B IS CREATED TO
4	REA	AD AS FOLLOWS:
5	<u>As u</u>	sed in Sections 1 to 7 of this Act, unless the context requires otherwise:
6	<u>(1)</u>	"Board" means a government agency, board, department, or other government
7		entity that regulates a lawful occupation and issues an occupational license or
8		government certification to an individual;
9	<u>(2)</u>	"Government certification" means a voluntary, government-granted, and
10		nontransferable recognition to an individual who meets personal qualifications
11		related to a lawful occupation. Upon the government's initial and continuing
12		approval, the individual may use "government certified" or "state certified" as a
13		title. A noncertified individual may also perform the lawful occupation for
14		compensation, but may not use the title "government certified" or "state
15		certified." "Government certification" shall not be synonymous with
16		"occupational license," and shall not include credentials that are prerequisites to
17		working lawfully in an occupation;
18	<u>(3)</u>	"Lawful occupation" means a course of conduct, pursuit, or profession that
19		includes the sale of goods or services that are not themselves illegal to sell
20		irrespective of whether the individual selling them is subject to an occupational
21		license;
22	<u>(4)</u>	"Military" means the United States Armed Forces, including the Air Force,
23		Army, Coast Guard, Marine Corps, Navy, Space Force, National Guard, and all
24		reserve components and auxiliaries. It also includes the military reserves and
25		militia of any United States territory or state;
26	<u>(5)</u>	"Occupational license" means a nontransferable authorization in law for an
27		individual to perform exclusively a lawful occupation based on meeting personal

1		qualifications, including military occupational specialties. In an occupation for
2		which a license is required, it is illegal for an individual who does not possess a
3		valid occupational license to perform the occupation;
4	<u>(6)</u>	"Other state" or "another state" means any territory or state of the United States,
5		other than this Commonwealth; and
6	<u>(7)</u>	"Scope of practice" means the procedures, actions, processes, and work that a
7		person may perform under an occupational license or government certification
8		issued in this Commonwealth.
9		→ SECTION 2. A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 335B IS CREATED TO
10	REA	AD AS FOLLOWS:
11	<u>(1)</u>	Notwithstanding any other law, the board shall issue an occupational license or
12		government certification to a person or military spouse upon application if all the
13		following apply:
14		(a) The person holds a current and valid occupational license or government
15		certification in another jurisdiction, including in a state, district, or territory
16		of the United States, or in a location outside of the United States, in a lawful
17		occupation with a similar scope of practice, as determined by the board in
18		this Commonwealth;
19		(b) The person has held the occupational license or government certification in
20		the issuing jurisdiction for at least one (1) year and is in good standing;
21		(c) The board in the issuing jurisdiction required the person to pass an
22		examination, or to meet education, training, or experience standards;
23		(d) The person does not have a disqualifying criminal record as determined by
24		the board in this Commonwealth;
25		(e) No board in another jurisdiction has revoked, nor has the person
26		surrendered in another jurisdiction, an occupational license or government
2.7		certification because of negligence or intentional misconduct related to the

1	person's work in the occupation;
2	(f) The person does not have a complaint, allegation, or investigation pending
3	before a board in another jurisdiction which relates to unprofessional
4	conduct or an alleged crime. If the person has a complaint, allegation, or
5	investigation pending, the board in this Commonwealth shall not issue or
6	deny an occupational license or government certification to the person
7	until:
8	1. The complaint, allegation, or investigation is resolved; or
9	2. The person otherwise meets the criteria for an occupational license or
10	government certification to the satisfaction of this Commonwealth's
11	board; and
12	(g) The person pays all applicable fees of the Commonwealth.
13	(2) If another jurisdiction issued the person or military spouse a government
14	certification but this Commonwealth requires an occupational license to work,
15	the board in this Commonwealth shall issue an occupational license to the person
16	if the person otherwise satisfies all the requirements.
17	→ SECTION 3. A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 335B IS CREATED TO
18	READ AS FOLLOWS:
19	(1) Notwithstanding any other law, the board shall issue an occupational license or
20	government certification to a person or military spouse, upon application based
21	on work experience in another jurisdiction, if all the following apply:
22	(a) The person worked in a jurisdiction that does not use an occupational
23	license or government certification to regulate a lawful occupation, but this
24	Commonwealth uses an occupational license or government certification to
25	regulate a lawful occupation with a similar scope of practice, as determined
26	by the board;
27	(b) The person worked for at least three (3) years in the lawful occupation; and

1	(c) The person satisfies the requirements of subsection (1)(d) to (g) of Section 2
2	of this Act.
3	(2) A board may require a person to pass a jurisprudential examination specific to
4	relevant state laws that regulate the occupation if an occupational license or
5	government certification in this Commonwealth requires a person to pass a
6	jurisprudential examination specific to relevant state statutes and administrative
7	regulations that regulate the occupation.
8	→SECTION 4. A NEW SECTION OF CHAPTER 335B IS CREATED TO
9	READ AS FOLLOWS:
10	(1) The board shall provide the person with a written decision regarding the
11	application within thirty (30) days after receiving a completed application.
12	(2) The person may appeal the board's decision to a court of general jurisdiction.
13	(3) The person may appeal the board's:
14	(a) Denial of an occupational license or government certification;
15	(b) Determination of the occupation; and
16	(c) Determination of the similarity of the scope of practice of the occupational
17	license or government certification issued.
18	→SECTION 5. A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 335B IS CREATED TO
19	READ AS FOLLOWS:
20	(1) A person who obtains an occupational license or government certification
21	pursuant to Sections 1 to 7 of this Act is subject to:
22	(a) The laws regulating the occupation in this Commonwealth; and
23	(b) The jurisdiction of the board in this Commonwealth.
24	(2) Sections 1 to 7 of this Act do not apply to an occupation regulated by this
25	Commonwealth's Supreme Court.
26	(3) Nothing in Sections 1 to 7 of this Act shall be construed to prohibit a person from
27	applying for an occupational license or government certification under another

1	statute or rule of this Commonwealth.
2	(4) An occupational license or government certification issued pursuant to Sections 1
3	to 7 of this Act is valid only in this Commonwealth. It does not make the person
4	eligible to work in another jurisdiction under an interstate compact or reciprocity
5	agreement unless otherwise provided in law.
6	(5) Nothing in Sections 1 to 7 of this Act shall be construed to require a private
7	certification organization to grant or deny private certification to any individual.
8	(6) The board may charge a fee to the applicant to recoup its costs not to exceed one
9	hundred dollars (\$100).
10	(7) Sections 1 to 7 of this Act preempt laws by municipal, county, and other
11	governments in this Commonwealth which regulate occupational licenses and
12	government certifications.
13	→SECTION 6. A NEW SECTION OF CHAPTER 335B IS CREATED TO
14	READ AS FOLLOWS:
15	(1) During a declared emergency, the Governor may order the recognition of an
16	occupational license from another jurisdiction as if the license is issued in this
17	Commonwealth.
18	(2) The Governor may expand any license's scope of practice and may authorize any
19	licensee to provide services in this Commonwealth in person, telephonically, or by
20	other means for the duration of the emergency.
21	→SECTION 7. A NEW SECTION OF CHAPTER 335B IS CREATED TO
22	READ AS FOLLOWS:
23	Sections 1 to 7 of this Act may be cited as the Universal Recognition of Occupational
24	Licenses Act.
