1	AN ACT relating to political activity of the Kentucky State Police.			
2	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:			
3	Section 1. KRS 16.170 is amended to read as follows:			
4	(1) As used in this section, unless the context requires otherwise:			
5	(a) ''Political activities'' includes but is not be limited to:			
6	<u>1. Registering to vote and exercising the right to vote;</u>			
7	2. Soliciting votes or endorsements on behalf of a political candidate or			
8	political campaign;			
9	3. Expressing opinions, either publicly or privately, on political subjects			
10	and candidates;			
11	4. Displaying political signs, pictures, stickers, badges, or buttons;			
12	5. Participating in the activities of, or contributing financially to, a			
13	political party, political group, candidate, campaign, or any			
14	organization that supports a political candidate or campaign;			
15	6. Attending or participating in a political convention, caucus, rally, or			
16	other political gathering;			
17	7. Initiating, circulating, or signing a petition in favor of or opposition to			
18	a candidate, public question, or a particular political position or			
19	<u>opinion;</u>			
20	8. Engaging in fundraising activities for any political party, political			
21	organization, political group, candidate, or campaign;			
22	9. Acting as a recorder, watcher, challenger, or similar officer at the			
23	polls on behalf of a political party, political organization, political			
24	group, candidate, or campaign; and			
25	10. Becoming a political candidate; and			
26	(b) ''Political group,'' ''political organization,'' and ''political party'' have the			
27	same meaning as in KRS 118.015.			

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1	<u>(2)</u>	<u>Nothing in this se</u>	ection or other provision of law shall prohibit an [ No] officer of
2		the department or	individual employed as a Trooper R Class or CVE R Class from
3		participating in p	political activities while off duty, out of uniform, and off the
4		premises of his or	her usual place of employment.
5	<u>(3)</u>	While engaging	in any political activity under this section, an officer of the
6		department or ind	dividual employed as a Trooper R Class or CVE R Class shall
7		<u>not:</u>	
8		(a) Wear a unif	form or any part of a uniform that would identify him or her as
9		<u>an officer or</u>	· trooper;
10		(b) Use any equ	ipment or property of the department;
11		(c) Display or	otherwise attempt to cause others to believe the officer or
12		<u>individual i</u>	s carrying a firearm, star, badge, or other indication of law
13		<u>enforcement</u>	<u>t authority;</u>
14		(d) Promote hir	nself or herself as an officer of the department or Trooper R
15		<u>Class, CVE</u>	<b>R</b> Class, or ISP officer representing the interests of the
16		<u>department;</u>	
17		<u>(e)</u> Solicit conti	ributions from department employees or other persons during
18		<u>regular wor</u>	king hours or, if a candidate, ask any subordinate to be a
19		<u>campaign vo</u>	olunteer or contribute to the campaign; or
20		<u>(f) Solicit or r</u>	eceive any political contribution of any kind while on state
21		property, un	less the property is rented or leased by a private individual or
22		<u>corporate er</u>	ntity[shall, directly or indirectly, give, solicit or receive, or be in
23		any manner	concerned in giving, soliciting or receiving, any assessment,
24		subscription	or contribution for any political party or political purpose
25		whatever. N	o officer or individual employed as a Trooper R Class or CVE R
26		Class shall,	orally or by letter, solicit or be in any manner concerned in
27		soliciting an	y assessment, subscription or contribution for any political party

1		or purpose whatever from any person holding a position in the department. No			
2		officer of the department or individual employed as a Trooper R Class or			
3		CVE R Class shall take any part in political management or affairs or in			
4		political campaigns further than to cast his vote and to express privately his			
5		<del>opinion]</del> .			
6	<u>(4)</u>	<u>Any</u> violation of <u>this section</u> [the provisions hereof] shall be grounds for removal.			
7		Section 2. KRS 16.195 is amended to read as follows:			
8	For officers governed by KRS 16.186 to 16.195, the following subjects shall be administered				
9	in the same manner as provided for state police officers governed by KRS 16.010 to 16.185:				
10	(1)	Prohibition against requesting or requiring victim of alleged sexual offense to			
11		submit to polygraph or other examination, as provided by KRS 16.062;			
12	(2)	Organization of the department, as provided by KRS 16.040(1);			
13	(3)	Additional duties of the department, as provided by KRS 16.065;			
14	(4)	Uniforms, equipment, and facilities, as provided by KRS 16.070;			
15	(5)	Automobile liability insurance, as provided by KRS 16.075;			
16	(6)	Bonds of employees, as provided by KRS 16.080;			
17	(7)	Training school, as provided by KRS 16.090;			
18	(8)	Officers required to take educational course on AIDS, as provided by KRS 16.095;			
19	(9)	Travel expenses and per diem allowances, as provided by KRS 16.100;			
20	(10)	Fees or rewards, as provided by KRS 16.110;			
21	(11)	Disabled officer on hazardous duty may elect to be retained on payroll, as provided			
22		by KRS 16.165.			
23	(12)	Election of benefits by disabled officer, as provided by KRS 16.167.			
24	(13)	<u>Restrictions on</u> political activity[ forbidden], as provided by KRS 16.170; and			
25	(14)	Indemnification of state police officer sued for act or omission in line of duty who			
26		suffers financial loss, as provided by KRS 16.185.			

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
