1 AN ACT relating to the administration of rabies vaccinations.

2 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:

- 3 → Section 1. KRS 258.005 is amended to read as follows:
- 4 As used in KRS 258.005 to 258.087, unless the context requires otherwise:
- 5 (1) "Dog" means any canine three (3) months of age or older for which there exists a
- 6 United States Department of Agriculture approved rabies vaccine;
- 7 (2) "Owner" means any person owning, keeping, or harboring a dog, cat, or ferret in
- 8 Kentucky;
- 9 (3) "Veterinarian" means a licensed practitioner of veterinary medicine;
- 10 (4) "Qualified person" means a person granted a permit by the secretary for health and
- family services to vaccinate his *or her* own dog against rabies;
- 12 (5) "Vaccination" means the administration by a veterinarian or other qualified person
- of rabies vaccine approved by and administered in accordance with administrative
- regulations promulgated by the secretary for health and family services;
- 15 (6) "Cat" means any feline three (3) months of age or older for which there exists a
- 16 United States Department of Agriculture approved rabies vaccine;
- 17 (7) "Animal control officer" means an individual who is employed or appointed by, or
- has contracted with:
- 19 (a) A city, county, urban-county, charter county, or consolidated local
- 20 government to enforce the provisions of this chapter, the provisions of the
- 21 Kentucky Revised Statutes relating to cruelty, mistreatment, sexual crimes
- against, or torture of animals, and local animal control ordinances; or
- 23 (b) An entity that has contracted with a city, county, urban-county, charter
- county, or consolidated local government to enforce the provisions of this
- chapter, the provisions of the Kentucky Revised Statutes relating to cruelty,
- 26 mistreatment, sexual crimes against, or torture of animals, and local animal

- 8 → Section 2. KRS 258.015 is amended to read as follows:

- 9 (1) Only veterinarians, certified animal euthanasia specialists, or qualified persons
 10 may administer rabies vaccinations to dogs, cats, and ferrets. Vaccinations
 11 performed by a certified animal euthanasia specialist shall be performed at the
 12 euthanasia specialist's place of employment.
 - Every owner shall have his <u>or her</u> dog, cat, or ferret initially vaccinated against rabies by the age of four (4) months and revaccinated at the expiration of the immunization period as certified by the veterinarian. The veterinarian <u>or certified animal euthanasia specialist</u> who vaccinates a dog, cat, or ferret shall issue to the owner a vaccination certificate on a form approved by the Cabinet for Health and Family Services. The vaccination certificate shall be prepared and issued in duplicate, one (1) copy to be retained by the issuing veterinarian <u>or certified animal euthanasia specialist</u> and one (1) copy to be given to the owner of the dog, cat, or ferret vaccinated. Each certificate shall bear the name and address of the veterinarian <u>or certified animal euthanasia specialist</u> who issued it. The veterinarian <u>or certified animal euthanasia specialist</u> who issued it. The veterinarian or certified animal euthanasia specialist shall also furnish each dog owner with a rabies tag bearing a serial number corresponding to the vaccination certificate with the year of immunization. The tag shall be affixed to a collar or harness furnished by the owner and shall be worn by the dog for which the tag was issued. No one except the owner or his **or her** duly authorized agent shall remove

- 2 (3) Every qualified person who vaccinates his <u>or her</u> own dog shall comply with
- 3 the vaccination certificate and tag requirement provisions of subsection (2)-(1) of
- 4 this section.
- 5 (4)-[(3)] Every owner of a cat or ferret shall show proof of a valid rabies vaccination
- 6 upon request of an animal control officer or peace officer.
- 7 → Section 3. KRS 258.043 is amended to read as follows:
- 8 (1) A local health department may sponsor mass rabies immunization clinics and shall
- 9 contract with local veterinarians, *certified animal euthanasia specialists*, *or both* to
- administer the rabies vaccine. If the services of veterinarians *or certified animal*
- 11 <u>euthanasia specialists</u> are not available in the area, the local health department may
- contract with other veterinarians or certified animal euthanasia specialists. The
- cabinet shall promulgate administrative regulations to establish a reasonable fee,
- not to exceed administrative costs of the program, to be charged to the owner of
- each dog, cat, or ferret to help defray the cost of the clinic.
- 16 (2) No owner shall be required to have his <u>or her</u> dog, cat, or ferret vaccinated at a
- public clinic if he *or she* elects to have his *or her* dog, cat, or ferret vaccinated
- privately by a veterinarian of his *or her* choice.
- 19 (3) No owner shall be required to have his <u>or her</u> dog vaccinated at a public clinic if he
- 20 <u>or she</u> is a qualified person and elects to vaccinate his <u>or her</u> dog himself.
