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AN ACT relating to responsible gaming.

## 2 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:

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→ Section 1. KRS 138.510 is amended to read as follows:

- 4 (1) (a) Before August 1, 2022, except as provided in paragraph (e) of this subsection
  5 and subsection (3) of this section, an excise tax is imposed on all tracks
  6 conducting pari-mutuel wagering on live racing under the jurisdiction of the
  7 commission as follows:
- 8 1. For each track with a daily average live handle of one million two 9 hundred thousand dollars (\$1,200,000) or above, the tax shall be in the 10 amount of three and one-half percent (3.5%) of all money wagered on 11 live races at the track during the fiscal year; and
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  For each track with a daily average live handle under one million two hundred thousand dollars (\$1,200,000), the tax shall be one and one-half percent (1.5%) of all money wagered on live races at the track during the fiscal year.
- (b) Beginning August 1, 2022, the excise tax imposed on all tracks conducting
  pari-mutuel wagering on live racing under jurisdiction of the commission
  shall be one and one-half percent (1.5%) of all money wagered on live races
  at the track during the fiscal year.
- (c) Beginning on April 1, 2014, an excise tax is imposed on all tracks conducting
  pari-mutuel wagering on historical horse races under the jurisdiction of the
  commission at a rate of one and one-half percent (1.5%) of all money wagered
  on historical horse races at the track during the fiscal year.
- 24 (d) Money shall be deducted from the tax paid under paragraphs (a), (b), and (c)
  25 of this subsection and deposited as follows:
- 261.a.Before August 1, 2022, an amount equal to three-quarters of one27percent (0.75%) of all money wagered on live races and historical

Beginning August 18 1, 2022, an amount equal to one percent (1%) of all money 19 wagered on live races at the track for harness racing shall be 20 deposited in the Kentucky standardbred development fund until a 21 total of twenty million dollars (\$20,000,000) has been deposited 22 during a fiscal year from this subparagraph, at which point the 23 amount deposited shall decrease to four-tenths of one percent 24 (0.4%) of all money wagered for the remainder of the fiscal year; 25 and 26 b. Beginning August 1, 2022, an amount equal to one percent (1%)

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of all money wagered on historical horse races at the track for

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1		harness racing shall be distributed in the exact amounts based
2		upon contracts between the parties that have been filed with the
3		commission, but at least one-half $(1/2)$ of the funds shall be
4		deposited into the Kentucky standardbred development fund
5		established in KRS 230.770 until a total of twenty million dollars
6		(\$20,000,000) has been deposited into the Kentucky standardbred
7		development fund during a fiscal year from this subparagraph, at
8		which point the amount deposited in this subdivision shall
9		decrease to four-tenths of one percent (0.4%) of all money
10		wagered for the remainder of the fiscal year. The commission shall
11		provide the department all information necessary from the
12		contracts in order for the funds in this subparagraph to be
13		distributed;
14	3. A	n amount equal to one percent (1%) of all money wagered on live

22a.To the equine industry program trust and revolving fund23established by KRS 230.550 to support the Equine Industry24Program at the University of Louisville, except that the amount25deposited from money wagered on historical horse races in any26fiscal year shall not exceed eight hundred fifty thousand dollars27(\$850,000);

1		b.	To the University of Kentucky for equine industry programs at the
2			university, except that the amount paid from money wagered on
3			historical horse races in any fiscal year shall not exceed four
4			hundred thousand dollars (\$400,000);
5		c.	To the Bluegrass Community and Technical College for the
6			provision of equine industry programs by the system, except that
7			the amount paid from money wagered on historical horse races in
8			any fiscal year shall not exceed two hundred fifty thousand dollars
9			(\$250,000);
10		d.	Amounts remaining from money wagered on historical horse races
11			in a fiscal year after payments are made in accordance with
12			subdivisions a., b., and c. of this subparagraph shall be distributed
13			in equal amounts to:
14			i. The Kentucky Thoroughbred breeders incentive fund
15			established in KRS 230.800, in an amount not to exceed four
16			hundred thousand dollars (\$400,000); and
17			ii. The Kentucky standardbred breeders incentive fund
18			established in KRS 230.802, in an amount not to exceed one
19			hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000); and
20		e.	Any amounts remaining from money wagered on historical horse
21			races in a fiscal year after payments are made in accordance with
22			subdivisions a., b., c., and d. of this subparagraph shall be paid to
23			the general fund;
24	5.	a.	An amount equal to one-tenth of one percent $(0.1\%)$ of all money
25			wagered on live races and historical horse races at the track shall
26			be deposited in a trust and revolving fund to be used for the
27			construction, expansion, or renovation of facilities or the purchase

1		of equipment for equine programs at state universities, except that
2		the amount deposited from money wagered on historical horse
3		races in any fiscal year shall not exceed three hundred twenty
4		thousand dollars (\$320,000).
5		b. These funds shall not be used for salaries or for operating funds
6		for teaching, research, or administration. Funds allocated under
7		this subparagraph shall not replace other funds for capital purposes
8		or operation of equine programs at state universities.
9		c. The Kentucky Council on Postsecondary Education shall serve as
10		the administrative agent and shall establish an advisory committee
11		of interested parties, including all universities with established
12		equine programs, to evaluate proposals and make
13		recommendations for the awarding of funds.
14		d. The Kentucky Council on Postsecondary Education may
15		promulgate administrative regulations to establish procedures for
16		administering the program and criteria for evaluating and awarding
17		grants; <del>[ and]</del>
18	6.	An amount equal to one-tenth of one percent $(0.1\%)$ of all money
19		wagered on live races and historical horse races shall be distributed to
20		the commission to support equine drug testing as provided in KRS
21		230.265(3), except that the amount deposited from money wagered on
22		historical horse races in any fiscal year shall not exceed three hundred
23		twenty thousand dollars (\$320,000); and
24	<u>7.</u>	An amount equal to one-tenth of one percent (0.1%) of all money
25		wagered on live races and historical horse races shall be distributed to
26		the Kentucky problem gambling assistance fund established in Section
27		2 of this Act, in an amount not to exceed five hundred thousand

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1			<u>dollars (\$500,000)</u> .
2		(e)	The excise tax imposed by paragraphs (a) and (b) of this subsection shall not
3			apply to pari-mutuel wagering on live harness racing at a county fair.
4	(2)	(a)	Except as provided in paragraph (c) of this subsection, an excise tax is
5			imposed on:
6			1. All tracks conducting telephone account wagering;
7			2. All tracks participating as receiving tracks in intertrack wagering under
8			the jurisdiction of the commission; and
9			3. All tracks participating as receiving tracks displaying simulcasts and
10			conducting interstate wagering thereon.
11		(b)	1. Before August 1, 2022, the tax shall be three percent (3%) of all money
12			wagered on races as provided in paragraph (a) of this subsection during
13			the fiscal year.
14			2. Beginning August 1, 2022, the tax shall be one and one-half percent
15			(1.5%) of all money wagered on races as provided in paragraph (a) of
16			this subsection during the fiscal year.
17		(c)	A noncontiguous track facility approved by the commission on or after
18			January 1, 1999, shall be exempt from the tax imposed under this subsection,
19			if the facility is established and operated by a licensed track which has a total
20			annual handle on live racing of two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000)
21			or less. The amount of money exempted under this paragraph shall be retained
22			by the noncontiguous track facility, KRS 230.3771 and 230.378
23			notwithstanding.
24		(d)	Money shall be deducted from the tax paid under paragraphs (a) and (b) of
25			this subsection as follows:
26			1. An amount equal to one percent (1%) of the amount wagered shall be
27			deposited as follows:

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1		a. In the Thoroughbred development fund established in KRS
2		230.400 if the host track is conducting a Thoroughbred race
3		meeting or the interstate wagering is conducted on a Thoroughbred
4		race meeting;
5		b. In the Kentucky standardbred development fund established in
6		KRS 230.770, if the host track is conducting a harness race
7		meeting or the interstate wagering is conducted on a harness race
8		meeting; or
9		c. In the Kentucky quarter horse, paint horse, Appaloosa, and
10		Arabian development fund established by KRS 230.445, if the host
11		track is conducting a quarter horse, paint horse, Appaloosa, or
12		Arabian horse race meeting or the interstate wagering is conducted
13		on a quarter horse, paint horse, Appaloosa, or Arabian horse race
14		meeting;
15	2.	An amount equal to twenty-five thousandths of one percent $(0.025\%)$ of
16		the amount wagered shall be allocated to the equine industry program
17		trust and revolving fund established by KRS 230.550 to be used to
18		support the Equine Industry Program at the University of Louisville;
19	3.	An amount equal to one-twentieth of one percent $(0.05\%)$ of the amount
20		wagered shall be deposited in a trust and revolving fund to be used for
21		the construction, expansion, or renovation of facilities or the purchase of
22		equipment for equine programs at state universities, as detailed in
23		subsection (1)(d)5. of this section; and
24	4.	An amount equal to one-twentieth of one percent $(0.05\%)$ of the amount
25		wagered shall be distributed to the commission to support equine drug
26		testing as provided in KRS 230.265(3).
27	(3) If a host	track in this state is the location for the conduct of a two (2) day

2	doll	ars (\$20,000,000) in purses and awards:
3	(a)	The excise tax imposed by subsection (1)(a) and (b) of this section shall not
4		apply to money wagered at the track on live races conducted at the track
5		during the two (2) day international horse racing event; and
6	(b)	Amounts wagered at the track on live races conducted at the track during the
7		two (2) day international horse racing event shall not be included in
8		calculating the daily average live handle for purposes of subsection (1) of this
9		section.
10	(4) The	taxes imposed by this section shall be paid, collected, and administered as
11	prov	vided in KRS 138.530.
12	⇒s	ECTION 2. A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 230 IS CREATED TO
13	READ A	S FOLLOWS:
14	<u>(1) (a)</u>	There is established in the State Treasury a revolving account to be known
15		as the Kentucky problem gambling assistance fund.
16	<u>(b)</u>	The fund shall be administered by the director of the Division of Behavioral
17		Health of the Department for Behavioral Health, Developmental and
18		Intellectual Disabilities, and shall consist of moneys distributed to it under
19		Section 1 of this Act.
20	<u>(c)</u>	Notwithstanding KRS 45.229, moneys remaining in the account at the close
21		of a fiscal year shall not lapse but shall carry forward into the succeeding
22		fiscal year. Interest earned on any moneys in the fund shall accrue to the
23		<u>fund.</u>
24	<u>(d)</u>	Except for administrative expenses of the Division of Behavioral Health
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24 25		relating to the fund, which shall be limited to fifty thousand dollars
		relating to the fund, which shall be limited to fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) per year, all moneys in the fund are appropriated for, and shall be

1	1. Providing support to agencies, groups, organizations, and persons that
2	provide education, assistance, and counseling to persons and families
3	experiencing difficulty as a result of addiction to alcohol or drugs or
4	addictive or compulsive gambling;
5	2. Promoting public awareness of and providing education about
6	addictions;
7	3. Establishing and funding programs to certify addiction counselors;
8	4. Promoting public awareness of assistance programs for addicts; and
9	5. Paying the costs and expenses associated with the treatment of
10	addictions.
11	(2) The racing commission shall promulgate administrative regulations to establish
12	criteria for the expenditure of funds from the Kentucky problem gambling
13	assistance fund. The administrative regulations shall:
14	(a) Establish standards for the types of agencies, groups, organizations, and
15	persons eligible to receive funding;
16	(b) Establish standards for the types of activities eligible for funding;
17	(c) Establish standards for the appropriate documentation of past performance
18	and the activities of agencies, groups, organizations, and persons requesting
19	<u>funding;</u>
20	(d) Establish standards for the development of performance measures or other
21	evidence of successful expenditure of awarded funds;
22	(e) Establish procedures for the submission, evaluation, and review of
23	applications for funding;
24	(f) Establish procedures for making funding awards to requesting entities who
25	have demonstrated the capability to efficiently and effectively provide the
26	necessary services;
27	(g) Establish requirements and procedures for the monitoring of funds

1	awarded, including requirements for the submission of reports and
2	documentation supporting expenditures; and
3	(h) Include any other provisions related to funding or the administration of the
4	account as determined by the racing commission.
5	(3) On or before October 1, 2024, and every October 1 thereafter, the director of the
6	Division of Behavioral Health, in cooperation with the commissioner of the
7	Department for Behavioral Health, Developmental and Intellectual Disabilities
8	and the secretary of the Cabinet for Health and Family Services, shall submit to
9	the Governor and the Legislative Research Commission an annual report
10	detailing activities and expenditures associated with the Kentucky problem
11	gambling assistance fund for the preceding fiscal year.
12	→SECTION 3. A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 230 IS CREATED TO
13	READ AS FOLLOWS:
14	(1) Any track licensed by the racing commission to conduct live horse racing or races
15	previously run shall implement a program to promote responsible gaming by its
16	patrons and provide details of the same to the racing commission. At a minimum,
17	the program shall require:
18	(a) Posting in a conspicuous place, in every place where pari-mutuel wagering
19	on historical horse racing is conducted, a sign that bears a toll-free
20	telephone number approved by the Kentucky Council on Problem Gambling
21	or other organization that provides assistance to problem gamblers;
22	(b) Providing informational leaflets or other similar materials on its licensed
23	premises on the dangers associated with problem gambling;
24	(c) Including in the licensee's promotional and marketing materials
25	information on problem gambling and organizations that provide assistance
26	to problem gamblers;
27	(d) Routine auditing of patron activity to identify patrons who have suffered

1	significant financial losses in repeated visits to its licensed premises and
2	providing such patrons with information on organizations that provide
3	assistance to problem gamblers;
4	(e) Training for employees at licensed tracks that also hold a license issued
5	under KRS 243.265 to identify patrons who have consumed excessive
6	amounts of alcohol to prevent such patrons from continuing to engage in
7	wagering activity while impaired;
8	(f) Forming a partnership with the Kentucky Council on Problem Gambling,
9	the National Council on Problem Gambling, or other similar organization
10	to identify and promote best practices for preventing problem gambling;
11	(g) Training for all employees who have contact with patrons, as well as
12	administrative and corporate staff members, that shall include skills and
13	procedures to respond to situations where a patron exhibits warning signs
14	of a gambling problem or where a patron discloses he or she may have a
15	gambling problem. Employees and staff shall be trained immediately upon
16	their hiring and retrained and tested regularly; and
17	(h) Providing that any request by a patron who wishes to self-exclude from the
18	licensed premises of a track regulated under this chapter is honored by the
19	licensee.
20	(2) A licensee shall report annually to the racing commission and make a copy
21	available to the public on its efforts to meet the requirements of subsection (1) of
22	this section, its efforts to identify problem gamblers, and steps taken to:
23	(a) Prevent such individuals from continuing to engage in pari-mutuel
24	wagering on historical horse racing; and
25	(b) Provide assistance to these individuals to address problem gambling activity.
