2023 Interim of the General Assembly. The task force shall submit findings and recommendations to the Legislative Research Commission for referral to the appropriate 6 committee or committees by December 1, 2023.

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- 7 → Section 4. All executive agencies and the Administrative Office of the Courts 8 shall promptly provide necessary data, research, and other requested information to assist 9 the task force.
- 10 **→**Section 5. Provisions of this Resolution to the contrary notwithstanding, the 11 Legislative Research Commission shall have the authority to alternatively assign the 12 issues identified herein to an interim joint committee or subcommittee thereof and to 13 designate a study completion date.

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
