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1 CONCURRENT RESOLUTION establishing the Multimodal Freight Transportation System Improvement Task Force. 2 3 WHEREAS, Kentucky's unique geographical location makes it an ideal hub for the 4 transportation of goods by highway, rail, river, and air; and 5 WHEREAS, Kentucky, located within a day's drive of two-thirds of the U.S. 6 population at the center of a 34-state distribution area in the eastern United States, has a 7 location advantage that facilitates the distribution of goods and materials to a massive 8 industrial and consumer market; and 9 WHEREAS, Kentucky ranks 2nd in the nation in total air cargo shipments and is 10 home to three global shipping hubs (UPS World Port, DHL Americas hub, and Amazon 11 Air global port), resources that put Kentucky at the heart of the global stream of 12 commerce; and 13 WHEREAS, Kentucky has over 1,400 miles of interstates and limited-access, 14 interstate grade parkways, to facilitate the free flow of commerce, including Interstates 65 15 and 75, two of the most vital freight corridors in the nation; and 16 WHEREAS, Kentucky, which ranks 4th in the nation with 1,020 miles of 17 commercially navigable waterways, is surrounded on three sides by the commercially 18 navigable rivers of the Mississippi, Ohio, and Big Sandy River, and also the Tennessee, 19 Cumberland, Green and Licking Rivers which are able to move freight, giving the 20 Commonwealth great advantages in being at the center of a vast inland waterways 21 network and at the confluence of several critical inland waterway routes; and 22 WHEREAS, Kentucky's 2,562 railroad miles, and 13 railroads, including two Class 23 1 railroads, are the fourth key component in the multimodal freight transportation 24 network; and 25 WHEREAS, the development of business models around "just in time" inventory 26 overnight delivery and the rapid transportation of freight has strained our nation's supply 27 chain over the last few years; and

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WHEREAS, improvements to Kentucky's multimodal freight transportation system

- 2 will require careful analysis and targeted public investment, which, if done properly,
- 3 could yield tremendous economic benefit for the entire Commonwealth;
- 4 NOW, THEREFORE,
- 5 Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the General Assembly of the
- 6 Commonwealth of Kentucky, the Senate concurring therein:
- 7 → Section 1. The Legislative Research Commission shall establish the Multimodal
- 8 Freight Transportation System Improvement Task Force. The task force shall study and
- 9 make recommendations regarding:
- 10 (1) Ports, freight, and air terminals, to review, correct, secure, and expand
- economic development opportunities, including ports for bulk river and rail service, as
- well as transit terminals for trucking and air freight;
- 13 (2) The state of the current freight transportation system to identify both gaps
- 14 where services are not available and existing facilities where backlogs exist and
- 15 expansion is warranted; and
- 16 (3) Funding opportunities, both one-time and recurring, that are available or may
- be necessary to fund improvements and maintain the system.
- → Section 2. The task force shall be composed of the following members, with
- 19 final membership of the task force being subject to the consideration and approval of the
- 20 Legislative Research Commission:
- 21 (1) Five members of the House of Representatives, appointed by the Speaker of
- 22 the House of Representatives, one of whom shall be designated by the Speaker of the
- 23 House of Representatives as a co-chair of the task force;
- 24 (2) Five members of the Senate, appointed by the President of the Senate, one of
- 25 whom shall be designated by the President of the Senate as a co-chair of the task force;
- 26 (3) The Secretary of the Cabinet for Economic Development, or the secretary's
- 27 designee;

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1 (4) The Secretary of the Transportation Cabinet, or the secretary's designee; and

2 (5) The Commissioner of the Department of Aviation, or the commissioner's

- 3 designee.
- ◆ Section 3. The task force shall meet as necessary during the 2023 Interim of the
- 5 General Assembly. The task force shall submit findings and recommendations to the
- 6 Legislative Research Commission for referral to the appropriate committees
- 7 by December 1, 2023.
- Section 4. Provisions of this Resolution to the contrary notwithstanding, the
- 9 Legislative Research Commission shall have the authority to alternatively assign the
- 10 issues identified herein to an interim joint committee or subcommittee thereof and to
- 11 designate a study completion date.
