A RESOLUTION recognizing January 27, 2023, as International Holocaust
 Remembrance Day.

WHEREAS, the Holocaust was the state-sponsored, systematic persecution and annihilation of European Jewry by Nazi Germany and its collaborators between 1933 and 1945 – six million Jews were murdered; Roma (Gypsies), people with disabilities, and Poles were also targeted for destruction or decimation for racial, ethnic, or national reasons; and millions more, including homosexuals, Jehovah's Witnesses, Soviet prisoners of war, and political dissidents, also suffered grievous oppression and death under Nazi tyranny; and

WHEREAS, the history of the Holocaust offers an opportunity to reflect on the
moral responsibilities of individuals, societies, and governments; and

WHEREAS, rising antisemitism reminds all of us of our moral responsibility tolearn from the past and stand against hate; and

WHEREAS, we the people of the Commonwealth of Kentucky should always
remember the terrible events of the Holocaust and remain vigilant against hatred,
persecution, and tyranny; and

WHEREAS, we the people of the Commonwealth of Kentucky should activelyrededicate ourselves to the principles of individual freedom in a just society; and

WHEREAS, Holocaust remembrance events will take place across the
Commonwealth, including Holocaust Education and Remembrance Week at the
University of Kentucky; and

WHEREAS, International Holocaust Remembrance Day has been set aside for the people of the Commonwealth of Kentucky to remember the victims of the Holocaust as well as to reflect on the need for respect of all peoples; and

WHEREAS, on November 1, 2005, the UN General Assembly adopted resolution 60/7 to designate January 27 as International Holocaust Remembrance Day (IHRD) to correspond with the anniversary of the liberation of Auschwitz-Birkenau, and it is meant

to honor the victims of Nazism and to condemn all forms of "religious intolerance,
incitement, harassment or violence against persons or communities based on ethnic origin
or religious belief" throughout the world;

5 Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the General Assembly of the 6 Commonwealth of Kentucky:

Section 1. The members of the House of Representatives hereby recognize January 27, 2023, as International Holocaust Remembrance Day, in memory of the victims of the Holocaust and in honor of the survivors as well as the rescuers and liberators, and further proclaim that we, as citizens of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, should work to promote human dignity and confront hate whenever and wherever it occurs.
