

1 A RESOLUTION celebrating the opening of the Trager Family Jewish Community  
2 Center in Louisville, Kentucky.

3 WHEREAS, the Jewish Community Center is a well-respected and integral part of  
4 the city of Louisville, Kentucky; and

5 WHEREAS, founded in 1878, the Young Hebrew Men's Association offered  
6 education, sports, theater, and music; and

7 WHEREAS, in 1955, the Young Hebrew Men's Association opened a new location  
8 on Dutchmans Lane which became a hub for Jewish life in the city, and it was aptly  
9 renamed the Jewish Community Center; and

10 WHEREAS, the Jewish Community Center has offered a plethora of services not  
11 only to those of the Jewish faith but also to the whole of the Louisville community; and

12 WHEREAS, in April 2022, a new 107,000 square-foot facility on Dutchmans Lane  
13 was opened and named the Trager Family Jewish Community Center; and

14 WHEREAS, the \$43 million project hosts a variety of fitness activities, including  
15 an indoor and outdoor aquatics center, two basketball courts, group exercise and training  
16 rooms, along with a cycle studio and elevated track; and

17 WHEREAS, additionally, the new Trager Family Jewish Community Center  
18 provides a 12-room preschool, auditorium, senior center, and cafe;

19 NOW, THEREFORE,

20 ***Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the General Assembly of the***  
21 ***Commonwealth of Kentucky:***

22 ➔Section 1. The House of Representatives commends the tremendous  
23 commitment to service the Jewish Community Center has demonstrated throughout its  
24 history and celebrates the opening of the Trager Family Jewish Community Center.

25 ➔Section 2. When the House of Representatives adjourns this day, it does so in  
26 celebration of the Trager Family Jewish Community Center and its continued role in  
27 improving the health of the community.
