1		AN ACT relating to the Kentucky Cybersecurity Center and making an
2	appro	opriation therefor.
3	Be it	enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:
4		→SECTION 1. A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 164 IS CREATED TO
5	REA	D AS FOLLOWS:
6	<u>(1)</u>	The General Assembly hereby finds that there is a growing threat of cyberattacks
7		across Kentucky. There is a need to address this threat by bringing together
8		public and private partners for workforce development, research, innovation, and
9		economic development. The National Security Agency, the United States
10		Department of Homeland Security, and the United States Department of Defense
11		have made significant investments in cybersecurity research, workforce training,
12		and education at the University of Louisville.
13	<u>(2)</u>	There is hereby created and established the Kentucky Cybersecurity Center
14		within the University of Louisville. For purposes of this section, the Kentucky
15		Cybersecurity Center shall be known as "KentuckyCYBER." The University of
16		Louisville shall have the authority to hire staff, contract for services, expend
17		funds, and operate the normal business activities of KentuckyCYBER.
18	<u>(3)</u>	It shall be the purpose of KentuckyCYBER to:
19		(a) Educate state and local agencies and private sector participants about how
20		to maintain secure cyberinfrastructure; and
21		(b) Accelerate the adoption of cybersecurity systems in the Commonwealth by
22		combining the assets of higher education, state and federal agencies, and
23		private companies.
24	<u>(4)</u>	The duties of KentuckyCYBER shall include but not be limited to:
25		(a) Train and upskill a workforce to provide cybersecurity solutions for
26		Kentucky businesses, state and local government, and federal, state, and
27		local law enforcement;

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1		(b) Provide cybersecurity resources, including but not limited to cyber ranges
2		and incident response teams, to assist state and local government, major
3		economic sectors including healthcare and manufacturing, and critical
4		infrastructure systems operators throughout Kentucky;
5		(c) Enhance economic development through cybersecurity initiatives that serve
6		major economic sectors of Kentucky;
7		(d) Create a cyber-innovation ecosystem for state and federal government, law
8		enforcement, the private sector, and K-12 and higher education institutions
9		to innovate rapidly and strengthen Kentucky's cybersecurity defenses with a
10		<u>qualified workforce;</u>
11		(e) Establish a cybersecurity research center and provide support to build the
12		research capacity necessary to successfully compete for projects funded by
13		the federal government and private industry participants; and
14		(f) Provide nonpartisan cybersecurity advice and recommendations to
15		<u>Kentucky policymakers.</u>
16	(5)	There is hereby created a trust and revolving fund to be known as the
17		KentuckyCYBER fund. The fund shall consist of moneys appropriated by the
18		General Assembly, contributions, gifts, or grants made available for the purposes
19		set forth in this section, which shall be excluded from the comprehensive funding
20		model established in KRS 164.092.
21	<u>(6)</u>	The fund shall be administered by the University of Louisville or its designated
22		<u>department.</u>
23	<u>(7)</u>	Notwithstanding KRS 45.229, any moneys remaining in the fund at the close of
24		the fiscal year shall not lapse but shall be carried forward to the next fiscal year.
25	<u>(8)</u>	Any interest earnings of the fund shall become a part of the fund and shall not
26		lapse.
27	<u>(9)</u>	Moneys deposited in the fund are hereby appropriated for the purposes set forth

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## 1 in this section and shall not be appropriated or transferred by the General

2 Assembly for any other purpose.

3 → Section 2. There is hereby appropriated General Fund moneys in the amount of

- 4 \$1,040,000 in fiscal year 2022-2023 and \$10,700,000 in fiscal year 2023-2024 to the
- 5 KentuckyCYBER Fund.
