24	(2)	The board shall promulgate administrative regulations in accordance with KRS
25		Chapter 13A for any certification or license the board may create. The

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1 Requirements for training; (b) 2 (c) Eligibility for certification or licensure; and 3 Renewal, recertification, and relicensure requirements. (d) 4 (3)The board may authorize a physician licensed to practice in Kentucky to serve as an 5 emergency medical services medical director if that physician meets the 6 requirements specified by the board by administrative regulation. 7 A hospital that owns an ambulance service that is exempt from certificate of need (4) 8 pursuant to KRS 216B.020(7) may provide transport services from another health 9 facility to its hospital if authorized by the ambulance service provider with 10 jurisdiction in the territory in which the other health facility is located.
