| 8 | WHEREAS, the championship game was a low-scoring contest until the Broncos |
| 9 | seized control on Ty Bryant's one yard touchdown run to grab a 14 to 7 lead with jus |
| 10 | over four minutes left in the third quarter. The Broncos then tacked on two fourth quarter |
| 11 | touchdown passes by quarterback Cole Carpenter to secure the championship; and |
| 12 | WHEREAS, for his stellar play on both offense and defense, which included 42 |
| 13 | rushing yards and a touchdown, as well as a key goal line interception of a Bowling |
| 14 | Green pass on the Purples' first offensive series, the Broncos' Ty Bryant was named the |
| 15 | Most Valuable Player of the championship game; and |
| 16 | WHEREAS, other Broncos offensive standouts in the championship game included |
| 17 | running backs TJ Horton and Devaun Hart, who ran for 108 and 52 yards, respectively |
| 18 | receivers Tylon Webb, Cameron Dunn, and Thomas Howard, who each caught a |
| 19 | touchdown pass; and quarterback Cole Carpenter, who threw for 149 yards and three |
| 20 | touchdowns; and |
| 21 | WHEREAS, key players for the Broncos' defense included linebacker Tresear |
| 22 | Benford, who had 5.5 tackles, including a sack and 1.5 tackles for loss; linebacker Darior |
| 23 | Neal, who had 4.5 tackles; and defensive back Isaiah Kenney, who had 2.5 tackles and ar |
| 24 | interception; and |
| 25 | WHEREAS, the victory in the championship game capped off what was not only a |
| 26 | perfect season for the Broncos, with a record of 15 wins against no losses, but a |
| 27 | dominating one that saw the Broncos outscore their opponents on the season by ar |

| 17 | Kennedy, and honorable mention selections running back TJ Horton, defensive lineman |
| 18 | Jalen Hand, linebacker Darion Neal, defensive back Isaiah Kenney, and punter Cooper |

| 20 | WHEREAS, the Broncos were led to the championship by head coach Nathan |
| 21 | McPeek, who, in his three seasons as a head coach, has compiled a record of 35 wins |
