3	WHEREAS, March is National Women's History Month, and during this month we
4	celebrate women who have been leaders not only in securing the rights of suffrage and
5	equal opportunity, but also in the abolitionist movement, the emancipation movement, the
6	industrial labor movement, the civil rights movement, and other movements which create
7	a more fair and just society for all; and
8	WHEREAS, women, now more than ever, serve in vital leadership roles in society
9	and contribute greatly to the United States and this Commonwealth; and
10	WHEREAS, during National Women's History Month, it is appropriate that we
11	celebrate the women of the Commonwealth of Kentucky who continue to make history;
12	and
13	WHEREAS, upon the swearing in of Cassie Chambers Armstrong as a member of
14	the Senate, the composition of women to men in the Senate will rise to a historic ratio of
15	nine women out of a total of 38 elected members; and
16	WHEREAS, Senator Chambers Armstrong joins the ranks of many strong,
17	powerful, and independent women who have been elected to change the laws and
18	advocate for the women, children, elderly, and underserved in Kentucky in order to
19	position them for a better future; and
20	WHEREAS, the women in the Senate today follow in the footsteps of the
21	trailblazing Senator Georgia Davis Powers, the first woman and the first person of color
22	elected to the Senate; and
23	WHEREAS, the 2023 General Assembly convenes with the highest number of
24	women elected to both chambers, with the House of Representatives being composed of
25	31 women out of 100 total representatives; and
