2	KHSAA Boys' Sweet Sixteen Basketball Champions.
3	WHEREAS, on March 18, 2023, before a crowd of 11,664 fans at Rupp Arena in
4	Lexington, the Warren Central High School Dragons defeated the Cardinals of George
5	Rogers Clark High School by a score of 64 to 60 to capture the 2023 Kentucky High
6	School Athletic Association (KHSAA) Boys' Sweet Sixteen Basketball Championship;
7	and
8	WHEREAS, in the championship game, a rematch from last year, the Dragons held
9	a 10-point lead after three quarters, then held off a furious Cardinal rally to avenge their
10	loss in 2023 with a balanced effort highlighted by three players, Damarion Walkup, Kade
11	Unseld, and Omari Glover, each scoring 17 points; and
12	WHEREAS, the state championship was for Warren Central was the second in
13	school history, with the Dragons having won the title in 2004; and
14	WHEREAS, the victory in the championship game was the capstone of a brilliant
15	season in which the Dragons compiled a record of 36 wins against a single loss, won their
16	last 27 games in a row, and outscored their opponents by an average of 23 points a game;
17	and
18	WHEREAS, the Dragons were an incredibly well-balanced team in terms of
19	scoring, with all of the team's five starters, Chappelle Whitney, Kade Unseld, Damarion
20	Walkup, Omari Glover, and Izayiah Villafuerte, averaging at least nine points per game
21	over the course of the season; and
22	WHEREAS, commenting on his team's selflessness, Dragons' Head Coach William
23	Unseld said, "They've shared the ball all year. Any of these guys could be somewhere
24	else and average 25 or 30 points a game. It's hard to guard when you have five really
25	good basketball players. I like playing teams when they have one or two"; and
26	WHEREAS, Chappelle Whitney was named the tournament's Most Valuable
27	Player, while Kade Unseld and Damarion Walkup were also named to the All-
