A RESOLUTION adjourning the Senate in honor and in loving memory of Flora
 Mae Page Smith.

WHEREAS, Flora Mae Page Smith was born in Louisville, Kentucky, to Moses
and Freda Mae Page on November 16, 1938; and

5 WHEREAS, Flora Smith graduated from Central High School in 1956, and 6 continued her education to graduate from Louisville General Hospital School of Nursing, 7 earning her pin as a Registered Nurse in 1959; and

8 WHEREAS, she continued public service by enlisting in the United States Navy, 9 obtained the rank of Lieutenant, and through admirable service received the National 10 Defense Service Medal before honorably ending her commission in 1968; and

WHEREAS, during her military service she met and married United States Army
soldier Frank Mitchell Smith. In 1969, Frank Mitchell Smith Jr. was born while his father
was stationed at the Panama Canal; and

WHEREAS, Flora continued her love of learning and of God's word by enrolling in
the Louisville Bible College. She was the first woman to enroll in the program and to
graduate with the Bachelor of Arts Degree; and

WHEREAS, she utilized her talents by working with women in the Louisville Community Correctional Center. She had a passion for serving others and facilitating support groups to provide young single mothers an opportunity to share challenges and gain support in an inclusive environment. She was well known for her letters and cards written in beautiful penmanship, filled with words of encouragement and hope; and

WHEREAS, during her mother's battle with Alzheimer's disease, Flora learned of systemic inequities in the treatment of black elderly individuals. She became an advocate for equitable and accessible health care for black seniors and low-income individuals that were often forced to seek healthcare at great distances from home and family support; and

WHEREAS, Flora became a vibrant and vital member of the working group

studying problems of the elderly with Senator Gerald Neal, striving to remove barriers to
 memory care and healthcare for seniors; and
