WHEREAS, Raymond Paul Wilt, loved sharing his hobbies with others, from teaching Latin to his grandsons, Robert and Ethan Purcell, to volunteering with New Beginnings Therapeutic Riding, the Knights of Columbus, and Hospice of Southern Kentucky; and

WHEREAS, Raymond Paul Wilt was a longtime parishioner and usher at Holy Spirit Catholic Church and St. Joseph Catholic Church, greeting parishioners at the door for 30 years; and

WHEREAS, Raymond Paul Wilt departed this earthly life on January 20, 2023; and
WHEREAS, Raymond Paul Wilt will be deeply missed by his community and his family;
