Beginning on page 1, after line 3, delete all language in its entirety and insert in lieu thereof the following:

"➔Section 1. Notwithstanding KRS 141.020(2)(a)2., the appropriations contained in this section are supported solely by funds from the Budget Reserve Trust Fund Account established by KRS 48.705 and shall not be identified as GF appropriations when certifying the reduction conditions pursuant to KRS 141.020(2)(a)5. and (d)2. to 5.

There is hereby appropriated General Fund moneys in the amount of \$203,500,000 in fiscal year 2023-2024, \$1,517,150,400 in fiscal year 2024-2025, and \$1,018,952,900 in fiscal year 2025-2026 from the Budget Reserve Trust Fund Account established by KRS 48.705 to support the following one-time appropriations:

7 Kentucky Transportation Cabinet to be distributed to the Danville-Boyle County Airport for the
8 Stuart-Powell Field;

9 (229)\$7,500,000 in each fiscal year to the Department of Highways budget unit in the
10 Kentucky Transportation Cabinet to implement the Short Line Infrastructure Preservation Pilot
11 Project. The Cabinet shall coordinate with and make grants to Class II and Class III railroads to
12 preserve and enhance existing rail lines and corridors, retain existing rail-served industries, and
13 attract new industries, and preserve and modernize Kentucky's rail system. Funds from the pilot
14 project shall be used for the purpose of leveraging state matching dollars in partnership with
15 participating railroads for the railroad federal grant applications, equipment, construction,
16 reconstruction, improvement, or rehabilitation of rail facilities or engineering work associated
17 with capital projects. No funds shall be expended from the pilot project unless matched with non-
18 state funds equaling at least 50 percent of the total amount for any individual project. No single
19 project shall receive more than \$2,000,000 in grant funds from the pilot project. Notwithstanding
20 KRS 45.229, any portion of these funds that have not been expended by the end of fiscal year
21 2024-2025 shall not lapse and shall carry forward into fiscal year 2025-2026. The Kentucky
22 Transportation Cabinet shall submit a report to the Legislative Research Commission and the
23 Interim Joint Committee on Appropriations and Revenue by September 1, 2025, detailing the
24 disbursement of funds in this subsection;

25 (230)\$7,500,000 in each fiscal year to the Department of Highways budget unit in the
26 Kentucky Transportation Cabinet to implement the Industrial Access and Safety Improvement
27 Pilot Project. The Kentucky Transportation Cabinet, in conjunction with the Cabinet for

1 Economic Development, shall review project proposals and the benefits provided in Kentucky.
2 Projects must provide one or more of the following applicable economic development and safety
3 improvement benefits:

4 (a) Provide Kentucky communities and industries with transportation options,
5 connectivity, and opportunities;

6 (b) Enhance rail line corridors to increase on-time performance; and

7 (c) Improve rail services to existing industries and encourage investment in the
8 Commonwealth;

9 The Kentucky Transportation Cabinet shall coordinate with and make grants to eligible
10 freight railroads operating in the Commonwealth, as well as to any Railroad Authority, Port
11 Authority, rail-served industries, and Industrial and Economic Development Authority Board to
12 expand rail access, enhance the marketability of available industrial sites, increase job creation
13 and capital investment, and increase safety. Funds from the pilot project shall be used for
14 equipment, construction, reconstruction, improvement, or rehabilitation of rail facilities or
15 engineering work associated with capital projects. No funds shall be expended from the pilot
16 project unless matched with non-state funds equaling at least 50 percent of the total amount for
17 any individual project. No single project shall receive more than \$2,000,000 in grant funds from
18 the pilot project. No one entity shall be eligible to receive more than 25 percent of total program
19 funds in a fiscal year. Notwithstanding KRS 45.229, any portion of these funds that have not
20 been expended by the end of fiscal year 2024-2025 shall not lapse and shall carry forward into
21 fiscal year 2025-2026. The Kentucky Transportation Cabinet shall submit a report to the
22 Legislative Research Commission and the Interim Joint Committee on Appropriations and
23 Revenue by September 1, 2025, detailing the disbursement of funds in this subsection;

24 (231) \$250,000,000 in fiscal year 2024-2025 and \$200,000,000 in fiscal year 2025-2026 to
25 the Department of Highways budget unit in the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet to support the
26 State Supported Construction Program and select construction projects within the 2024-2026
27 Biennial Highway Construction Program. The select construction projects are identified for

1 industrial development, economic and quality improvement, or located in counties that are
2 projected to have the largest change in total population in both numeric and percentage gain.
3 Notwithstanding KRS 45.299, these funds shall not lapse and shall carry forward;

4 (232) \$10,000,000 in fiscal year 2024-2025 to the Department for Local Government
5 budget unit to be distributed to the City of Covington for infrastructure at the Covington Central
6 Riverfront site;

7 (233) \$5,000,000 in fiscal year 2024-2025 to the Emergency and Targeted Investment Fund
8 established by KRS 157.618; and

9 (234) \$2,000,000 in fiscal year 2024-2025 to the Department for Local Government budget
10 unit to be distributed to the Edmonson County Fiscal Court to provide an emergency
11 infrastructure grant. This grant will require a local match of at least \$1,000,000.

12 ➔Section 2. Notwithstanding KRS 15.470, the appropriations contained in this section
13 are supported solely by funds from the Kentucky Law Enforcement Foundation Program Fund
14 established by KRS 15.430.

15 There is hereby appropriated Restricted Funds in the amount of \$56,395,000 in fiscal year
16 2024-2025 to support the following one-time appropriations:

17 (1) \$50,000,000 to the Criminal Justice Training budget unit to construct to the Western
18 Kentucky Law Enforcement Training Academy in the City of Madisonville. The Department
19 shall collaborate with the City of Madisonville to plan, design, and construct the training
20 academy; and

21 (2) \$6,395,000 in fiscal year 2024-2025 to the State Police budget unit to purchase lab
22 equipment consisting of:

23 (a) One mobile DNA response unit;

24 (b) One single nucleotide polymorphism instrument, including validation services and
25 testing kits;

26 (c) Six GS/MC detector instruments;

27 (d) One 3-D firearm imaging system;

- 1 (e) Two gas chromatography/mass spectrometry instruments;
- 2 (f) Two GC/MS/FID instruments;
- 3 (g) One scanning electron microscope;
- 4 (h) 240 intoxilyzer instruments;
- 5 (i) One time-of-flight mass spectrometer; and
- 6 (j) 15 laboratory fleet vehicles.

7 ➔Section 3. Whereas the provisions of this Act provide ongoing support for state
8 government agencies and their functions, an emergency is declared to exist, and this Act takes
9 effect upon its passage and approval by the Governor or upon its otherwise becoming a law."
