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1	A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION establishing the Autonomous Vehicle Task
2	Force.
3	WHEREAS, artificial intelligence is an expanding technology in both the private
4	and public sectors in Kentucky; and
5	WHEREAS, mobile users and companies are using artificial intelligence-powered
6	applications, and leading businesses are routinely investing in artificial intelligence
7	initiatives; and
8	WHEREAS, artificial intelligence involves rapidly advancing technology and
9	science to create problem-solving measures for the private and public sectors; and
10	WHEREAS, artificial intelligence has become more prevalent in individual and
11	commercial use in Kentucky, and individual companies have expressed interest in doing
12	business with Kentucky to provide services powered by artificial intelligence; and
13	WHEREAS, autonomous or self-driving vehicles are vehicles that operate on public
14	roadways without direct human input or control of the steering, acceleration, and braking
15	of the vehicle utilizing artificial intelligence to operate the motor vehicle; and
16	WHEREAS, automakers across the country are developing, testing, and deploying
17	autonomous vehicles with estimates of up to 3.5 million autonomous vehicles on
18	roadways by 2025; and
19	WHEREAS, autonomous vehicle technology is not new and continues to develop.
20	Safety standards relating to how autonomous vehicles and their artificial intelligence
21	systems interact with human-driven vehicles and how they respond to crashes,
22	pedestrians, and other hazards continue to improve; and
23	WHEREAS, as each state adopts its own framework for autonomous vehicle
24	technology, they consider different requirements for insurance coverage; and
25	WHEREAS, autonomous vehicles will have a considerable economic impact, both
26	in vehicle sales and in the commercial hauling industry; and
27	WHEREAS, without a uniform national framework for the regulation of

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1 autonomous vehicles, the Commonwealth is at risk of delayed autonomous vehicle

- 2 adoption as other states move to enact their own autonomous vehicle legislation;
- 3 NOW, THEREFORE,
- 4 Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the General Assembly of the
- 5 Commonwealth of Kentucky, the Senate concurring therein:
- Section 1. The Legislative Research Commission is hereby directed to establish
- 7 the Artificial Intelligence and Autonomous Vehicle Task Force to conduct a
- 8 comprehensive review of existing artificial intelligence applications and autonomous
- 9 vehicles. The Artificial Intelligence and Autonomous Vehicle Task Force shall study and
- 10 make recommendations regarding:
- 11 (1) Strategies used by other states to study and monitor artificial intelligence
- systems developed, employed, and procured by state agencies in other states;
- 13 (2) State agencies in other states currently using artificial intelligence systems in
- 14 government operations;
- 15 (3) Any existing Kentucky agencies using artificial intelligence systems and those
- 16 systems;
- 17 (4) Information on artificial intelligence systems used by other groups, including
- 18 Kentucky businesses and the federal government;
- 19 (5) How Kentucky's government agencies' use of artificial intelligence systems
- 20 would benefit their operation and procurement policies and the legislative initiatives
- 21 needed to provide consumer protection in the private and public sectors;
- 22 (6) The potential safety implications of autonomous vehicles on Kentucky's
- 23 roadways;
- 24 (7) Other state's models for insurance coverage and legal liability for autonomous
- 25 vehicles; and
- 26 (8) The economic impact of the use of autonomous vehicles, and the impact on
- 27 the commercial driving industry and employment, if any.

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→ Section 2. The Artificial Intelligence and Autonomous Vehicle Task Force shall be composed of the following members, with final membership of the task force being subject to the consideration and approval of the Legislative Research Commission:

- Four members of the House of Representatives appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives, one of whom shall be a member of the minority party, and one of whom shall be designated by the Speaker of the House of Representatives as a cochair of the task force; and
- Four members of the Senate appointed by the President of the Senate, one of whom shall be a member of the minority party, and one of whom shall be designated by 10 the President of the Senate as a co-chair of the task force.
 - → Section 3. The Artificial Intelligence and Autonomous Vehicle Task Force shall meet at least three times during the 2024 Interim and shall submit its findings, legislative recommendations, or a memorandum to the Legislative Research Commission no later than December 1, 2024. If legislative recommendations are submitted, the Legislative Research Commission may refer the recommendations to the appropriate committee or committees of jurisdiction in advance of the 2025 Regular Session of the Kentucky General Assembly.
 - **→**Section 4. Provisions of this Resolution to the contrary notwithstanding, the Legislative Research Commission shall have the authority to alternatively assign the issues identified herein to an interim joint committee or subcommittee thereof, and to designate a study completion date.

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
