4	(1)	If a	school district[school council or, if none exists, the principal] adopts a
5		curri	culum for human sexuality or sexually transmitted diseases, instruction shall
6		inclu	ide but not be limited to the following content:
7		(a)	Abstinence from sexual activity is the desirable goal for all school-age
8			children;
9		(b)	Abstinence from sexual activity is the only certain way to avoid unintended
10			pregnancy, sexually transmitted diseases, and other associated health
11			problems;
12		(c)	The best way to avoid sexually transmitted diseases and other associated
13			health problems is to establish a permanent mutually faithful monogamous
14			relationship;
15		(d)	A policy to respect parental rights by ensuring that:
16			1. Children in grade five (5) and below do not receive any instruction
17			through curriculum or programs on human sexuality or sexually
18			transmitted diseases; or
19			2. Any child, regardless of grade level, enrolled in the district does not
20			receive any instruction or presentation that has a goal or purpose of
21			students studying or exploring gender identity, gender expression, or
22			sexual orientation; and
23		(e)	A policy to notify a parent in advance and obtain the parent's written consent
24			before the parent's child in grade six (6) or above receives any instruction
25			through curriculum or programs on human sexuality or sexually transmitted
26			diseases authorized in this section.

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Each school district shall adopt health curriculum for students in grade six (6) or

2		<u>instr</u>	ruction on human growth and development shall include a presentation of:
3		<u>(a)</u>	A high-definition ultrasound video, at least three (3) minutes in duration,
4			showing the development of the brain, heart, sex organs, and other vital
5			organs in early fetal development; and
6		<u>(b)</u>	A high-quality, computer-generated rendering or animation showing the
7			process of fertilization and every stage of human development inside the
8			uterus, noting significant markers in cell growth and organ development for
9			every week of pregnancy until birth.
10	<u>(3)</u>	Any	course, curriculum, or program offered by a public school on the subject of
11		hum	an sexuality or human growth and development provided by school personnel
12		or b	y third parties authorized by the school shall:
13		(a)	Provide an alternative course, curriculum, or program without any penalty to
14			the student's grade or standing for students whose parents have not provided
15			written consent as required in subsection (1)(e) of this section;
16		(b)	Be subject to an inspection by parents of participating students that allows
17			parents to review the following materials:
18			1. Curriculum;
19			2. Instructional materials;
20			3. Lesson plans;
21			4. Assessments or tests;
22			5. Surveys or questionnaires;

2	<u>(4)[(3)]</u>	A public school offering any course, curriculum, or program on the subject of
3	hum	an sexuality <u>or human growth and development</u> shall provide written
4	notif	fication to the parents of a student at least two (2) weeks prior to the student's
5	plan	ned participation in the course, curriculum, or program. The written notification
6	shall	l:
7	(a)	Inform the parents of the provisions of subsection $(3)[(2)]$ of this section;
8	(b)	Provide the date the course, curriculum, or program is scheduled to begin;
9	(c)	Detail the process for a parent to review the materials outlined in subsection
10		(3)[(2)] of this section;
11	(d)	Explain the process for a parent to provide written consent for the student's
12		participation in the course, curriculum, or program; and
13	(e)	Provide the contact information for the teacher or instructor of the course,
14		curriculum, or program and a school administrator designated with oversight.
15	<u>(5)</u> [(4)]	Nothing in this section shall prohibit school personnel from:
16	(a)	Discussing human sexuality, including the sexuality of any historic person,
17		group, or public figure, where the discussion provides necessary context in
18		relation to a topic of instruction from a curriculum approved pursuant to KRS
19		160.345; or
20	(b)	Responding to a question from a student during class regarding human
21		sexuality as it relates to a topic of instruction from a curriculum approved
22		pursuant to KRS 160.345.
23	(6) (a)	Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, the Attorney General
24		may bring a civil action for a writ of mandamus to compel a public school
25		district to comply with subsections (1) to (4) of this section.
26	<u>(b)</u>	Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, a parent or student
27		over the age of eighteen (18) may file a civil action against the school

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1	district for injunctive relief arising from a violation of subsections (1) to (4)
2	of this section. A civil action brought under this section may be brought in
3	the Circuit Court of the county in which the school district is located.
4	Sovereign and governmental immunity are waived for any claim filed under
5	this subsection and arising from a violation of subsections (1) to (4) of this
6	section. The remedies identified in this section shall be in addition to, and
7	not in lieu of, any other remedies available in law or equity.
8	→ Section 2. This Act may be cited as the Baby Olivia Act.

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
