4	<u>(1) (a)</u>	[Beginning as of January 1, 1984, ]The members of the General Assembly,
5		other than the Speaker of the House of Representatives, [ the] President of the
6		Senate, [ the] Speaker Pro Tempore of the House of Representatives, President
7		Pro Tempore of the Senate, [ and the] majority and minority leadership of each
8		house of the General Assembly, chairs of standing committees of the House
9		of Representatives or the Senate, or chairs of interim joint committees of the
10		Legislative Research Commission, shall each receive as compensation sixty
11		thousand dollars (\$60,000) per year.[one hundred dollars (\$100) per day, ]
12	<u>(b)</u>	The President of the Senate <sub>1</sub> [ and the] Speaker of the House of
13		Representatives, President Pro Tempore of the Senate, Speaker Pro
14		Tempore of the House of Representatives, and shall each receive as
15		compensation one hundred twenty five dollars (\$125) per day, The] majority
16		and minority <i>leadership</i> [ floor leaders] of each house of the General
17		Assembly[ shall each receive as compensation one hundred twenty dollars
18		(\$120) per day, and the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, the Speaker Pro

27		dollars (\$65,000) per year[ten dollars (\$10) for each regularly scheduled

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- meeting of the standing committee which he chairs during sessions of the

   (2) [Beginning as of July 1, 1980, ]Each member of the General Assembly shall receive
   mileage and reimbursement of road tolls for one (1) round trip for each week of the
- session between his <u>or her</u> home and the State Capitol during regular sessions and
  extraordinary sessions of the General Assembly and the necessary travel in going to
  and returning from the sessions of their respective houses. The mileage allowance
  under this section shall be equal to the maximum mileage allowance permitted by
  the federal government, to be increased as federal mileage allowance is increased.
- 10 (3) On the first and fifteenth of each month, the secretary of the Finance and
- 11 Administration Cabinet shall draw his or her warrant on the Treasurer in favor

14 → Section 2. KRS 6.211 is amended to read as follows:

15 [Effective January 1, 1994, ]In addition to any and all sums, compensation, or expenses 16 now paid the members of the General Assembly, each shall receive an expense allowance 17 of one hundred ten percent (110%) of the expense allowance paid federal employees 18 traveling in the Frankfort, Kentucky, area for each calendar day. This sum shall be paid 19 whether the General Assembly is in regular or extraordinary session and shall be in full 20 recompense of any additional expenses incurred in excess of that now received by them.

 $\rightarrow$  Section 3. KRS 6.225 is amended to read as follows:

Between sessions of the General Assembly, offices shall be maintained in the State Capitol building for the use and benefit of the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives. <u>When the General Assembly is not in session</u>, [Except when the General Assembly is in session] the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives shall <u>be reimbursed for traveling expenses each day they</u> are engaged in the duties of their offices [each receive an amount per day equal to the per

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1 diem compensation they receive during sessions of the General Assembly for each day 2 they are engaged in the duties of their offices and shall be reimbursed for necessary 3 traveling expenses]. 4 → Section 4. KRS 7.110 is amended to read as follows: 5 (1)*(a)* The Commission, its <u>co-chairs</u>[co-chairmen] or director, any other member of 6 the General Assembly authorized by the director, or any employee authorized 7 by the director, shall have access to all public records as provided in KRS 61.870 to 61.884, of every agency, division or department of state 8 9 government, and of any agency or institution, public or private, which has 10 been the recipient of public funds. 11 <u>(b)</u> The Commission, its *co-chairs*[co-chairmen] or director, any other member of 12 the General Assembly authorized by the director, or any employee authorized 13 by the director, may utilize automated data processing procedures and 14 equipment in the accession of public records, if such records exist in machine 15 readable form. To effect the purposes of this section, the Commission shall 16 promulgate such rules and regulations relating to the accession of public 17 records as are necessary. 18 The Commission, its *co-chairs*[co-chairmen] or director, any other member (c)19 of the General Assembly authorized by the director, or any employee 20 authorized by the director, may require information on oath of any person 21 touching any matter which he or she is instructed to investigate, study, or 22 audit, and shall have the power to subpoena witnesses and records for such 23 purpose, and otherwise compel the giving of evidence of any matter under 24 study. If any person fails or refuses to testify or furnish documentary evidence 25 concerning any matter with respect to which the Commission desires 26 information pertaining to the studies in which it is engaged, the Franklin 27 Circuit Court, on application of the Commission, may compel obedience by

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1 proceedings for contempt as in the case of disobedience of a subpoena issued 2 from the Circuit Court or a refusal to testify therein. Every witness so 3 subpoenaed under this section shall receive for his <u>or her</u> attendance the fee 4 and mileage provided for witnesses in civil cases in Circuit Court, which shall 5 be audited and paid upon the presentation of proper vouchers sworn to by the 6 witness and approved by the Commission.

7 (2) All state agencies and institutions shall cooperate with the Commission to
8 effectuate the purposes of KRS 7.090 to 7.110 and shall submit copies of their
9 annual or biennial reports to the Commission.

10 (3) The Commission shall encourage and arrange conferences with officials of other 11 states and of other units of government; carry forward the participation of this state 12 as a member of the Council of State Governments, both regionally and nationally, 13 and formulate proposals for cooperation between this state and other states. The 14 Legislative Research Commission shall function as Kentucky's commission on 15 interstate cooperation in carrying out the program of the Council of State 16 Governments as it relates to Kentucky.

17 (4) The Commission shall designate persons to represent Kentucky at the National
18 Conference of Commissioners on Uniform State Laws. The Commission shall
19 report the findings and recommendations of the national conference to the General
20 Assembly. Any funds appropriated to the commissioners on uniform state laws
21 shall be paid out on vouchers approved by the director of the Commission.

(5) (a) The Commission may establish such subcommittees and advisory citizens'
committees as may be convenient or desired for the proper and efficient
performance of its functions. Members of the General Assembly[ other than
those who are members of the Commission designated to serve on
subcommittees] shall receive the same travel allowances[ and compensation]
for attending meetings as they do for attending meetings during a session of

9	to the Governor of the Commonwealth[,] and to each member of the General
10	Assembly at least thirty (30) days prior to the convening of each regular session of
11	the General Assembly.
