3		→ Section 1. KRS 223.170 is amended to read as follows:	
4	<u>(1)</u>	The Energy and Environment Cabinet shall certify persons as to their qualifications	
5		to supervise successfully the operation of water treatment plants or water	
6		distribution systems after considering the recommendations of a board of	
7		certification which shall be appointed by the secretary of the Energy and	
8		Environment Cabinet or his <u>or her</u> designee.	
9	<u>(2)</u>	The board shall consist of the following:	
10		(a) Two (2) members who are currently employed as waterworks operators	
11		holding valid certificates;	
12		$(\underline{b})$ One (1) member employed by a municipality who holds the position of either	
13		city manager, city engineer, director of public works, or the equivalent	
14		thereof;	
15		(c) One (1) member who is a faculty member of a college, university, or	
16		professional school whose major field is related to water supply; and	
17		$(\underline{d})$ One (1) ex officio member representing the Energy and Environment Cabinet.	
18		Board members shall serve for a four (4) year term or until their successors are	
19		appointed and qualify.	
20	<u>(3)</u>	The Energy and Environment Cabinet representative shall serve as executive	
21		secretary and treasurer of the board and be responsible for maintaining records. The	
22		members of the board shall serve without compensation, but may be reimbursed for	
23		all actual and necessary expenses incurred while discharging their official duties.	
24	<u>(4)</u>	On or before December 31, 2024, the board shall submit to the cabinet

12	(1)	The	Kentucky Board of Certification of Wastewater System Operators is
13		estal	olished. The board shall recommend qualified applicants to the cabinet for
14		certi	fication and perform other acts as may be necessary to carry out the purposes of
15		this	section. Members of the board shall be appointed by the Governor. The board
16		shall	consist of eight (8) members who may have professional backgrounds as
17		follo	ws:
18		<u>(a)</u>	One (1) employee of a municipality who holds the position of either city
19			manager, city engineer, director of public works, or the equivalent thereof;
20		<u>(b)</u>	One (1) member who is a faculty member of a college, university, or
21			professional school whose major field is related to wastewater treatment;
22		<u>(c)</u>	One (1) nonvoting ex officio member representing the cabinet; and
23		<u>(d)</u>	Five (5) members currently employed as operators holding valid certificates

cabinet's representative shall serve as executive secretary and treasurer and be
responsible for maintaining records. The members of the board shall serve without
compensation but may be reimbursed for all actual and necessary expenses incurred
while discharging their official duties. At least four (4) existing members of the
board shall constitute a quorum.

- (2) No person shall have primary responsibility for the operation of any sewage system or portion thereof whether publicly or privately owned unless:
  - (a) The person has passed an examination prescribed by the Energy and Environment Cabinet and board which shall determine the person's skill and competency for the operation and has been issued a certificate to that effect by the cabinet; or
    - (b) The person is operating a sewage system located at the residence where the person lives and the sewage system serves only one (1) residence.
- (3) No person shall authorize or allow any person who does not hold a certificate issued pursuant to subsection (2) of this section to have primary responsibility for the operation of any sewage system or portion thereof.
- (4) The cabinet, with the advice of the board of certification, may classify all sewage systems and portions thereof in the manner provided by the rules and regulations of the cabinet with regard to size, type, physical conditions affecting such systems or portions thereof, and the skill, knowledge and experience required for the operation of the system or portion thereof and restrict the application of any certificate issued pursuant to subsection (2) of this section to the operation of a sewage system or portion thereof of a specific class.
- 26 (5) Any person who has primary responsibility for the operation of a sewage system for a school shall be entitled to a limited certificate of competency for his *or her*

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	particular system, provided he <u>or she</u> has demonstrated that he <u>or she</u> has the
	knowledge and experience required to operate properly the particular sewage
	system for which he or she is responsible. A limited certificate of competency so
	issued is not transferable to any other sewage system, nor is the period of operation
	under such a limited certificate eligible for consideration toward the experience
	requirements for a certificate of competency as provided in subsection (2) of this
	section.
(6)	All applicants for the examination and certification for the operation of any sewage
	system or portion thereof, whether publicly or privately owned, shall pay a
	reasonable schedule of fees and charges fixed by regulation. The fees required
	under this section shall be payable to the cabinet.
(7)	Operators shall have accumulated a minimum number of hours of appropriate board
	approved training set by regulation for certificate renewal. Such training shall
	include, but may not be limited to, correspondence courses, short courses, trade
	association meetings, and on-the-job training. Training hours accumulated in any
	given year in excess of the minimum requirement necessary for renewal may be
	carried forward for a period not to exceed two (2) years.
(8)	The board may waive any or all of the requirements of subsection (7) of this section
	for all or portions of an established class of operators.
<u>(9)</u>	On or before December 31, 2024, the board shall submit to the cabinet
	recommendations for the establishment of:
	(a) A voluntary certification program for supervisors of certified operators in
	primary responsible charge of public or private sewage systems or any
