- 1 AN ACT relating to the rights of incarcerated children. 2 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky: 3 → SECTION 1. A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 600 IS CREATED TO 4 **READ AS FOLLOWS:** 5 A child incarcerated pursuant to the statewide detention program established in KRS 6 15A.305 shall have the right to: 7 (1) Be kept safe, informed, and free from emotional, psychological, verbal, and 8 physical abuse; 9 (2) Speak with, see, and touch their family; 10 (3) Access appropriate medical, mental health, and behavioral health care; 11 An education meeting their individual needs; (4) 12 A nutritious and healthy diet; (5) Be treated with respect and recognition of their dignity and individuality; 13 **(6)** 14 (7) Be free from unreasonable use of seclusion and restraint; *Receive notice of and participate in court hearings;* 15 (8) 16 (9) Access counsel; and 17 (10) Not be judged, blamed, or stigmatized by detention.
- 18 → Section 2. This Act may be cited as The Incarcerated Children's Bill of Rights.
