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1	AN ACT relating to career and technical education funding, making an
2	appropriation therefor, and declaring an emergency.
3	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:
4	→SECTION 1. KRS 157.069 IS REPEALED AND REENACTED TO READ
5	AS FOLLOWS:
6	(1) As used in this section:
7	(a) "Administrative operations costs" means costs associated with the
8	operations and staffing of a state-operated area technology center,
9	including but not limited to personnel, facility costs, building utilities and
10	maintenance, and custodial and office supplies;
11	(b) "Approved career and technical education dual credit" means earning a
12	grade of "C" or higher for a Kentucky Department of Education-approved
13	career and technical education dual credit course equivalent to three (3)
14	hours of college credit;
15	(c) "Approved career and technical education pathway" means a four (4)
16	course career and technical education pathway approved by the Kentucky
17	Department of Education that provides a coherent, articulated sequence of
18	rigorous academic and career-related courses within a career and technical
19	education program area, and leads to an associate degree, an industry-
20	recognized certificate or license, or a baccalaureate or higher degree;
21	(d) "Concentrator" means a student who has earned at least two (2) credits for
22	no less than two (2) courses in a single career and technical education
23	<u>pathway;</u>
24	(e) "Converted career and technical education center" means a center
25	providing locally operated career and technical education for which a local
26	district assumed authority from the state for the management and control of
27	the center during the 2020-2021, 2021-2022, or 2022-2023 academic years;

1	<u>(f)</u>	"General-cost career and technical education program" means a career
2		and technical education program or pathway in which high-cost technical
3		equipment, materials, or facilities are not required;
4	<u>(g)</u>	"General-cost full-time equivalents" means the total number of secondary
5		students enrolled in general-cost career and technical education programs,
6		multiplied by the number of hours those students are enrolled, and divided
7		<u>by six (6) hours;</u>
8	<u>(h)</u>	"High-cost career and technical education program" means a career and
9		technical education program or pathway in which high-cost equipment,
10		materials, or facilities are required;
11	<u>(i)</u>	"Locally operated career and technical education" means a district
12		program that provides secondary students with one (1) or more approved
13		career and technical education pathways;
14	<u>(j)</u>	"State-operated area technology center" means a state-operated secondary
15		school facility with the primary purpose of offering approved career and
16		technical education pathways;
17	<u>(k)</u>	"Supplemental funding" or "supplemental funds" means moneys
18		appropriated by the General Assembly to support qualifying locally operated
19		career and technical education centers and programs and state-operated
20		area technology centers and programs based on enrollment and incentive
21		<u>criteria;</u>
22	<u>(l)</u>	"Technical skill attainment" means earning an industry-recognized
23		certification, licensure, or credential as identified by the Kentucky
24		Workforce Innovation Board pursuant to KRS 158.6455(1)(e) or passing an
25		end-of-program assessment for articulated postsecondary credit as
26		designated by the Kentucky Department of Education Office of Career and
27		Technical Education;

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1	<u>(m)</u> ''Weight	ed high-cost full-time equivalents'' means the total number of
2	secondar	ry students enrolled in high-cost career and technical education
3	program	s, multiplied by the number of credit hours in which those students
4	<u>are enro</u>	lled, divided by six (6) hours, and multiplied by one and one-half
5	<u>(1.5); an</u>	<u>d</u>
6	<u>(n)</u> ''Work-b	pased learning program'' means a cooperative education program,
7	internshi	ip, or registered apprenticeship within the student's chosen
8	approved	d career and technical education pathway.
9	(2) The Kentuck	y Department of Education shall provide funds from the
10	department's	annual general fund appropriation to support the administrative
11	operations cos	sts of state-operated area technology centers and converted career
12	and technical	education centers.
13	(3) For converted	career and technical education centers, beginning with fiscal year
14	<u>2024-2025, th</u>	ne Kentucky Department of Education shall deduct from funds
15	designated for	the state-operated area technology centers an amount equal to the
16	<u>administrative</u>	operations costs of each converted career and technical education
17	<u>center in the a</u>	amount received by the center in the most recent fiscal year that the
18	<u>center was un</u>	nder state management and control. The funds for each converted
19	<u>career and tec</u>	hnical education center shall be divided as follows:
20	(a) Seventy-	five percent (75%) of the funds shall be sent to the local district that
21	<u>has assu</u>	med management and control of the center; and
22	(b) Twenty-f	five percent (25%) of the funds shall be sent to the career and
23	<u>technica</u>	l education innovation and support fund established in subsection
24	<u>(4) of thi</u>	is section.
25	(4) (a) There is	hereby established in the State Treasury a restricted fund to be
26	<u>known a</u>	s the career and technical education innovation and support fund
27	<u>to receiv</u>	the funds allocated under subsection (3)(b) of this section. The

1	fund shall consist of moneys received from state appropriations, gifts,
2	grants, and federal funds. The fund shall be administered by the Office of
3	Career and Technical Education. Amounts deposited in the fund shall be
4	used for:
5	<u>1.</u> Supporting innovation in new or emerging career fields;
6	2. Supporting state-operated area technology centers that may
7	experience hardship or natural disasters;
8	3. Personnel costs to provide technical assistance to local districts
9	providing locally operated career and technical education, including
10	technical assistance relating to the monitoring and oversight on the
11	use of supplemental career and technical education funding; and
12	4. Any other purposes reasonably related to improving student outcomes
13	in career and technical education.
14	(b) Notwithstanding KRS 45.229, fund amounts not expended at the close of a
15	fiscal year shall not lapse but shall be carried forward into the next fiscal
16	<u>year.</u>
17	(5) Beginning with the 2024-2025 fiscal year and for each fiscal year thereafter, the
18	Kentucky Department of Education shall distribute to local districts providing
19	locally operated career and technical education and to state-operated area
20	technology centers all general funds designated as supplemental funds to career
21	and technical education programs, subject to the following:
22	(a) A local district providing locally operated career and technical education or
23	a state-operated area technology center shall maintain eligibility for receipt
24	of federal funding pursuant to the Strengthening Career and Technical
25	Education for the 21st Century Act, Pub. L. No. 115-224, to be eligible to
26	receive supplemental funding pursuant to this subsection;
27	(b) All supplemental funds distributed pursuant to this subsection shall be used

1	to improve student outcomes in career and technical education pathways for
2	students in grades nine (9) through twelve (12), including but not limited to
3	student supplies, resources, materials, and equipment that is designed for
4	enhanced quality of instruction in a career and technical education
5	pathway, the purchase and maintenance of industry standard equipment,
6	assisting students with achieving technical skill attainment, and supporting
7	career and technical student organization participation;
8	(c) 1. Supplemental funds for career and technical education shall be
9	divided and allocated to each local district providing locally operated
10	career and technical education and to each state-operated area
11	technology center, with sixty percent (60%) dedicated for enrollment-
12	based funding and forty percent (40%) for incentive-based funding.
13	2. The sixty percent (60%) enrollment-based funding shall be based on a
14	statewide full-time equivalent calculation of the total weighted high-
15	cost full-time equivalents and general-cost full-time equivalents
16	during the prior school year, subject to the following:
17	a. The department shall then distribute the enrollment-based funds
18	for each state-operated area technology center or local district
19	providing locally operated career and technical education based
20	on the center's or district's proportional share of the combined
21	weighted high-cost full-time equivalents and general-cost full-
22	time equivalents of the prior year;
23	<u>b. The department shall distribute the state-operated area</u>
24	technology center fund portion to the respective state-operated
25	area technology centers and the local district fund portion to the
26	respective local districts; and
27	c. The department shall classify qualifying programs as either a

1	high-cost career and technical education program or a general-
2	cost career and technical education program.
3	3. The forty percent (40%) incentives-based funding shall be based on an
4	annual statewide calculation of the total number of qualifying student
5	incentives. The calculation shall only use students that are in grade
6	twelve (12) and use the total incentives earned by those students
7	during secondary education at a state-operated area technology center
8	or within a local district. Once a student has been included in a year's
9	calculation, that student shall not be included in any subsequent
10	year's calculation, subject to the following:
11	a. Qualifying student incentives for students in their grade twelve
12	(12) year shall include:
13	<i>i. Reaching the designation of a concentrator;</i>
14	ii. Technical skill attainment;
15	iii. Completing a required number of hours or achieving a
16	benchmark within a work-based learning program; and
17	iv. Earning an approved career and technical education dual
18	<u>credit;</u>
19	b. The incentives in subdivision a. of this subparagraph shall be
20	allotted to the state-operated area technology center or local
21	district in which it was earned. Each type of incentive shall only
22	be counted once per student at state-operated area technology
23	centers and once per student at local districts for a maximum of
24	four (4) incentives per student at state-operated area technology
25	centers and four (4) incentives at local districts throughout their
26	secondary career and technical education. For incentive criteria
27	that is achieved more than once at state-operated area

1	technology centers, the incentive shall be counted for the state-
2	operated area technology center where it was first achieved. For
3	incentive criteria that is achieved more than once at local
4	districts, the incentive shall be counted for the local district
5	<u>where it was first achieved;</u>
6	c. The department shall distribute incentives-based funds for each
7	state-operated area technology center or local district based on
8	the center's or district's proportional share of the combined
9	number of qualifying student incentives achieved by students in
10	grade twelve (12) at a state-operated area technology center or
11	within a local district throughout their secondary career and
12	technical education. The incentives-based funds shall be
13	distributed to the state-operated area technology center or local
14	district in which the incentive was achieved; and
15	d. The department shall distribute the state-operated area
16	technology center fund portion to the respective state-operated
17	area technology centers and the local district fund portion to the
18	respective local districts;
19	(d) There shall be no mid-year adjustment to the allocation of career and
20	technical education supplemental funding for a center or local district; and
21	(e) Notwithstanding the restriction in paragraph (b) of this subsection, a district
22	may submit a waiver request to the Office of Career and Technical
23	Education to use a portion of its allocation of supplemental funds for career
24	and technical education programming for students in grades (5) through
25	eight (8). The district shall submit a request which details the district's plan
26	for career and technical education programming for students in grades five
27	(5) through eight (8). In reviewing the request, the Office of Career and

1		Technical Education shall consider whether:
2		1. The district details a plan for orientation and exploration of broad-
3		based industries by giving students knowledge and experience
4		regarding careers within these industries and exploratory or hands-on
5		skills used in the industry;
6		2. There is direct alignment between middle and secondary career and
7		technical education pathways within the requesting district; and
8		3. Such designation of supplemental funding for programming for
9		students in grades five (5) through eight (8) does not have a
10		significant detrimental impact on the programming available for
11		students in secondary grades.
12	<u>(6)</u>	The Office of Career and Technical Education shall monitor and provide
13		oversight of state funds distributed pursuant to this section to ensure that the use
14		of funding by eligible recipients meets the approved criteria as described in this
15		section.
16	<u>(7)</u>	The Kentucky Board of Education shall promulgate administrative regulations in
17		accordance with KRS Chapter 13A as may be needed in the administration of this
18		section and for disbursement of moneys.
19	<u>(8)</u>	The Kentucky Department of Education shall publish on the department's
20		website:
21		(a) The list of all career and technical education programs available to students
22		and the program's designation as a high-cost career and technical
23		education program or as a general-cost career and technical education
24		program;
25		(b) A report of the supplemental funding amounts provided to each local
26		district and to each state-operated area technology center, including an
27		explanation of the amount designated as enrollment-based funding and as

1		incentives-based funding; and
2	<u>(c)</u>	A report of the administrative operations costs provided to each state-
3		operated area technology center and to each converted career and technical
4		education center, as well as the amount contributed toward the career and
5		technical education innovation and support fund.

6 \blacksquare Section 2. (1) To the extent that funds are made available for this purpose, 7 a local board of education shall provide a one-time award to any employee of a converted 8 career and technical education center as defined in subsection (1)(e) of Section 1 of this 9 Act who was employed by the converted career and technical education center at the time 10 of conversion and who remains employed by the same local board of education that 11 assumed operational control. The one-time award shall be an amount up to 14.48 percent 12 of the employee's salary at the time of conversion, which is based on the raises subsequently provided for executive branch state employees and shall provide the 13 14 qualifying employees what they would have received had the career and technical 15 education center remained under state operation. The award amount shall be calculated 16 by the Kentucky Department of Education for each qualifying employee.

17 (2) A local board of education shall request reimbursement for the amount of one-18 time award payments made pursuant to this section from the fund to support education 19 excellence in Kentucky established in KRS 157.330. If the amount appropriated for 20 reimbursement of award payments is insufficient, then each award shall be reduced 21 proportionally.

(3) The Kentucky Department of Education shall ensure equitable distribution offunds under this section.

(4) Notwithstanding the payment provided in subsection (1) of this section being
a one-time award, a local board of education may recognize the one-time award amount
as reflective of the appropriate annual salary for an employee receiving the award under
the conditions established by subsection (1) of this section, and may use resources

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available to the local board of education to increase an employee's annual salary
 accordingly.

3 → Section 3. There is hereby appropriated General Fund moneys in the amount of
4 \$170,000 in fiscal year 2023-2024 to the Learning and Results Services budget unit to
5 support the payment of awards set forth in Section 2 of this Act.

Section 4. Whereas it is critical to ensure that funding for career and technical
education is equitable across the state, aligns with fiscal years, reflects student
enrollment, and fosters successful outcomes in workforce preparation, an emergency is
declared to exist, and Sections 2 and 3 of this Act take effect upon its passage and
approval by the Governor or upon its otherwise becoming a law, and Section 1 of this Act
takes effect on July 1, 2024.
