2	Be i	t enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:
3		→ Section 1. KRS 158.141 is amended to read as follows:
4	(1)	Beginning with the entering ninth grade class of the 2025-2026 school year and
5		each year thereafter, completion of a one-half (1/2) credit course in civic literacy
6		that includes instruction in the areas required in subsection (3) of this section
7		shall be a graduation requirement for each student in every public high school in
8		Kentucky [on July 1, 2018, to graduate from a Kentucky public high school with a
9		regular diploma, a student shall pass a civics test composed of one hundred (100)
10		questions drawn from those that are set forth within the civics test administered by
11		the United States Citizenship and Immigration Services to persons seeking to
12		become naturalized citizens].
13	(2)	A student pursuing an early graduation program as established in KRS 158.142
14		shall complete the required instruction prior to the student's graduation [local
15		board of education shall prepare or approve a test composed of the questions
16		described in subsection (1) of this section and shall disseminate the test to all public
17		high schools of the district. The test shall be administered by the public high
18		schools in each district].
19	(3)	A civic literacy course shall include but not be limited to instruction in the
20		following areas:
21		(a) An overview of America's founding history, including but not limited to key
22		texts; the role and operations of local, state, and national governments; the
23		rights and responsibilities of citizenship; federalism; civil liberties; and civil
24		<u>rights;</u>
25		(b) Principles of the United States government;
26		(c) The Constitution of Kentucky and the Constitution of the United States;
27		(d) Institutions of the United States government and the responsibilities of the

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1		executive branch, legislative branch, and judicial branch;
2		(e) State government and local governments and the role of each;
3		(f) Political parties and interest groups;
4		(g) Campaigns and elections;
5		(h) United States Congress;
6		(i) Domestic policy;
7		(j) Foreign policy;
8		(k) Comparative systems;
9		(l) International relations; and
10		(m) Major issues facing government[public high school shall provide each
11		student with the opportunity to take the test as many times as necessary for the
12		student to pass the test. A student shall not receive a regular high school
13		diploma until the student passes the test].
14	(4)	The Kentucky Board of Education shall promulgate administrative regulations in
15		accordance with KRS 156.160 to establish academic standards for civic literacy[A
16		student passes the test if at least sixty percent (60%) of the questions are answered
17		correctly.
18	(5)	A student who has passed a similar test within the previous five (5) years shall not
19		be required to take the test under this section.
20	(6)	Provisions of this section shall be subject to the requirements and accommodations
21		of a student's individualized education program as defined in KRS 158.281 or a

Section 504 Plan as defined in KRS 156.027].

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
