2	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:
3	→SECTION 1. A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 205 IS CREATED TO
4	READ AS FOLLOWS:
5	The cabinet shall be responsible for overseeing and administering nonemergency
6	medical transportation services for Medicaid beneficiaries. In fulfilling its duties under
7	this section, the cabinet shall:
8	(1) Approve individual nonemergency medical transportation vendors throughout the
9	Commonwealth;
10	(2) Ensure that any Medicaid-enrolled provider is approved as a nonemergency
11	medical transportation broker for reimbursement purposes;
12	(3) Establish a process by which any local school district may be approved as a
13	nonemergency medical transportation broker, be eligible to be a reimbursed
14	broker, and provide nonemergency medical transportation services reimbursable
15	under the state's Medicaid program;
16	(4) Establish a process for reimbursing ride-sharing services for providing
17	nonemergency medical transportation to Medicaid-covered services;
18	(5) Establish policies that permit a Medicaid beneficiary to request to add up to one
19	(1) additional stop for additional Medicaid-covered services, including but no
20	limited to requesting a stop for pharmacy services, when utilizing nonemergency
21	medical transportation services;
22	(6) Permit, when possible, same day scheduling for nonemergency medica
23	transportation services;
24	(7) Include information about nonemergency medical transportation benefits on
25	Medicaid membership cards provided to enrollees; and
26	(8) Take full advantage of all federally permitted nonemergency medica

1	(a) Improve access to nonemergency medical transportation services;
2	(b) Increase the efficiency of nonemergency medical transport services;
3	(c) Reduce the cost of nonemergency medical transportation services;
4	(d) Improve the quality of nonemergency medical transportation services; or
5	(e) Otherwise improve access to healthcare by Medicaid beneficiaries who are
6	in need of nonemergency medical transportation services.
