2	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:
3	→SECTION 1. A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 324B IS CREATED TO
4	READ AS FOLLOWS:
5	(1) The following professional healthcare licensing boards shall update their
6	licensure renewal forms in accordance with this section:
7	(a) Professional licensure boards as defined in KRS 211.332;
8	(b) Kentucky Board of Medical Imaging and Radiation Therapy established in
9	<u>KRS 311B.030;</u>
10	(c) State Board of Podiatry established in KRS 311.410; and
11	(d) Kentucky Department for Public Health, in regards to community health
12	workers certified under KRS 309.462.
13	(2) The professional healthcare licensing boards identified in subsection (1) of this
14	section shall include data fields containing the following information on their
15	licensure renewal forms, as applicable for a given profession:
16	(a) License number and date of issuance;
17	(b) National Provider Identifier number;
18	(c) Name of the licensing board the licensee considers to be his or her primary
19	board of record for professional healthcare credentials;
20	(d) Whether the licensee possesses a secondary license from a separate
21	healthcare licensure board in Kentucky;
22	(e) Whether the licensee is also licensed by a professional board in another
23	<u>state;</u>
24	(f) The licensee's first, middle, and last name;
25	(g) The highest level of education possessed by the licensee that corresponds to
26	his or her role as a healthcare professional;
27	<u>(h) Race;</u>

1		(i) Ethnicity;
2		(j) Sex;
3		(k) Date of birth;
4		(1) Whether the licensee is licensed in Kentucky through an interstate compact;
5		(m) State in which the licensee resides;
6		(n) County in which the licensee resides;
7		(o) Kentucky county in which the licensee primarily practices;
8		(p) Percentage of the licensee's time spent on activities related to patient care;
9		(q) Percentage of the licensee's time spent on activities related to patient
10		healthcare delivered via telehealth;
11		(r) Whether the licensee speaks a language other than English at a level of
12		fluency to be able to communicate important healthcare information with
13		his or her non-English-speaking patients;
14		(s) Physical addresses of all practice locations;
15		(t) Specialty areas of practice;
16		(u) Ability to meet patient needs of special populations;
17		(v) Whether the licensee accepts insurance, including Medicaid and Medicare;
18		and
19		(w) Whether the provider sees children or youth under eighteen (18) years of
20		age.
21	<u>(3)</u>	The professional healthcare licensing boards identified in subsection (1) of this
22		section shall report data as necessary, and upon request, to the Department of
23		Insurance and the Cabinet for Health and Family Services for workforce
24		capacity and workforce reporting and tracking purposes.
25		Section 2. Section 1 of this Act takes effect January 1, 2026.
