A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 426A IS CREATED TO 15 **READ AS FOLLOWS:** 16 (1) Sections 1 to 11 of this Act shall apply to a Canadian judgment to the extent the 17 judgment is within the scope of Section 3 of the Uniform Foreign-Country Money 18 Judgments Recognition Act, if recognition of the judgment is sought to enforce 19 the judgment. 20 (2) A Canadian judgment that grants both recovery of a sum of money and other 21 relief may be registered under Sections 1 to 11 of this Act, but only to the extent 22 of the grant of recovery of a sum of money. 23 (3) A Canadian judgment regarding subject matter both within and not within the 24 scope of Sections 1 to 11 of this Act may be registered under Sections 1 to 11 of this Act, but only to the extent the judgment is with regard to subject matter 25 26 within the scope of Sections 1 to 11 of this Act. 27 → SECTION 4. A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 426A IS CREATED TO

2	<u>(1)</u>	A person seeking recognition of a Canadian judgment described in Section 3 of
3		this Act to enforce the judgment may file the judgment in the office of clerk of the
4		court in which an action for recognition of the judgment could be filed under
5		Section 6 of the Uniform Foreign-Country Money Judgments Recognition Act.
6	<u>(2)</u>	A registration under subsection (1) of this section shall be executed by the person
7		registering the judgment or the person's attorney and include:
8		(a) A copy of the Canadian judgment authenticated under Section 6 of the
9		Uniform Foreign-Country Money Judgments Recognition Act as an
10		accurate copy by the court that entered the judgment;
11		(b) The name and address of the person registering the judgment;
12		(c) If the person registering the judgment is not the person in whose favor the

15		seek its recognition and enforcement;
16		(d) The name and last known address of the person against whom the judgment

14	3. If a part of the judgment is being registered, the amounts stated in the

17	(j) If the judgment is not in English, a certified translation of the judgment
18	into English; and
19	(k) A registration fee set by rule of the Kentucky Supreme Court in accordance
20	with KRS 23A.200 and 24A.170.
21	(3) On receipt of a registration that includes the documents, information, and
22	registration fee required in subsection (2) of this section, the clerk of the court
23	shall file the registration and, except as may be otherwise provided in Sections 1
24	to 11 of this Act, shall treat the judgment in the same manner as a judgment of
25	any court or this state as provided in KRS 426.955.
26	(4) A registration substantially in the following form complies with the registration
27	requirements in subsection (2) of this section if the registration includes the

13	READ AS FOLLOWS:
14	(1) Subject to subsection (2) of this section, a Canadian judgment registered under
15	Section 4 of this Act has the same effect provided in Section 7 of the Uniform
16	Foreign-Country Money Judgments Recognition Act for a judgment a court
17	determines to be entitled to recognition.
18	(2) A Canadian judgment registered under Section 4 of this Act shall not be enforced
19	by sale or other disposition of property, or by seizure of property, until thirty-one
20	(31) days after notice of registration under Section 6 of this Act is served. The
21	court for cause may provide for a shorter or longer time. This subsection shall
22	not preclude use of relief available under the laws of this state other than
23	Sections 1 to 11 of this Act to prevent dissipation, disposition, or removal of
24	property.
25	→SECTION 6. A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 426A IS CREATED TO
26	READ AS FOLLOWS:
27	(1) A person that registers a Canadian judgment under Section 4 of this Act shall

1	cause notice of registration to be served on the person against whom the
2	judgment has been registered.
3	(2) Notice under this section shall be served in the same manner as a summons and
4	complaint is required to be served in an action seeking recognition under Section
5	6 of the Uniform Foreign-Country Money Judgments Recognition Act of a
6	foreign-country money judgment.
7	(3) Notice under this section shall include:
8	(a) The date of registration and the court in which the judgment was registered;
9	(b) The case number assigned to the registration;
10	(c) The name and address of:
11	1. The person registering the judgment; and
12	2. The person's attorney, if any;
13	(d) A copy of the registration, including the documents required under
14	subsection (2) of Section 4 of this Act; and
15	(e) A statement that:
16	1. The person against whom the judgment has been registered, not later
17	than thirty (30) days after the date of service of notice, may petition
18	the court to vacate the registration; and
19	2. The court may, for good cause shown, provide for a shorter or longer
20	<u>time.</u>
21	(4) Proof of service of the notice under this section shall be filed with the court.
22	→SECTION 7. A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 426A IS CREATED TO
23	READ AS FOLLOWS:
24	(1) No later than thirty (30) days after service of the notice required under Section 6
25	of this Act, the person against whom the judgment was registered may petition the
26	court to vacate the registration. The court, for good cause shown, may provide for
27	a shorter or longer time for filing the petition.

1	(2) A petition filed under this section may only assert:
2	(a) A ground that could be asserted to deny recognition of the judgment under
3	the Uniform Foreign-Country Money Judgments Recognition Act; or
4	(b) A failure to comply with a requirement of Sections 1 to 11 of this Act for
5	registration of the judgment.
6	(3) A petition filed under this section shall not in and of itself stay enforcement of the
7	registered judgment.
8	(4) If the court grants a petition under this section, the registration shall be vacated,
9	and any act under the registration to enforce the registered judgment is void.
10	(5) If the court grants a petition under this section on a ground under subsection
11	(2)(a) of this section, the court shall also enter a judgment denying recognition of
12	the Canadian judgment. A judgment entered under this subsection shall have the
13	same effect as a judgment denying recognition of a judgment on the same ground
14	under the Uniform Foreign-Country Money Judgments Recognition Act.
15	→ SECTION 8. A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 426A IS CREATED TO
16	READ AS FOLLOWS:
17	A person that filed a petition under subsection (1) of Section 7 of this Act to vacate
18	registration of a Canadian judgment may request the court to stay enforcement of the
19	judgment pending a determination of the petition. The court shall grant the stay if the
20	person establishes a likelihood of success on the merits with regard to a ground listed
21	in subsection (2) of Section 7 of this Act for vacating a registration. The court may
22	require the person to provide security in an amount determined by the court as a
23	condition of granting the stay.
24	→SECTION 9. A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 426A IS CREATED TO
25	READ AS FOLLOWS:
26	(1) Sections 1 to 11 of this Act supplement the Uniform Foreign-Country Money
27	Judgments Recognition Act and all provisions except Section 6 of that Act apply

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1	to a registration under Sections 1 to 11 of this Act.
2	(2) A person may seek recognition of a Canadian judgment described in Section 3 of
3	this Act either:
4	(a) By registration under Sections 1 to 11 of this Act; or
5	(b) Under Section 6 of the Uniform Foreign-Country Money Judgments
6	Recognition Act.
7	(3) Subject to subsection (4) of this section, a person may not seek recognition in this
8	state of the same judgment or part of a judgment described in subsection (2) or
9	(3) of Section 3 of this Act with regard to the same person under both Sections 1
10	to 11 of this Act and Section 6 of the Uniform Foreign-Country Money
11	Judgments Recognition Act.
12	(4) If the court grants a petition to vacate a registration solely on a ground under
13	subsection (2)(b) of Section 7 of this Act, the person seeking registration may:
14	(a) If the defect in the registration can be cured, file a new registration under
15	Sections 1 to 11 of this Act; or
16	(b) Seek recognition of the judgment under Section 6 of the Uniform Foreign-
17	<b>Country Money Judgments Recognition Act.</b>
18	→SECTION 10. A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 426A IS CREATED
19	TO READ AS FOLLOWS:
20	In applying and construing this uniform act, consideration shall be given to the need to
21	promote uniformity of the law with respect to its subject matter among states that enact
22	<u>it.</u>
23	→SECTION 11. A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 426A IS CREATED
24	TO READ AS FOLLOWS:
25	Sections 1 to 11 of this Act shall apply to the registration of a Canadian judgment
26	entered in a proceeding that is commenced in Canada on or after the effective date of
27	this Act.
