27 (1) A person is guilty of possession of a handgun by a minor when, being under the age

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1		of e	ighteen (18) years, he or she possesses, manufactures, or transports a handgun
2		as de	efined by KRS 527.010, except when the person is:
3		(a)	In attendance at a hunter's safety course or a firearms safety course;
4		(b)	Engaging in practice in the use of a firearm, or target shooting at an
5			established firing range, or any other area where the discharge of a firearm is
6			not prohibited;
7		(c)	Engaging in an organized competition involving the use of a firearm, or
8			participating in or practicing for a performance by a group organized under
9			Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code or any successor thereto
10			which uses firearms as a part of the performance;
11		(d)	Hunting or trapping pursuant to a valid license issued to him or her pursuant
12			to the statutes or administrative regulations of this Commonwealth;
13		(e)	Traveling to or from any activity described in paragraphs (a) to (d) of this
14			subsection with any unloaded handgun in his or her possession;
15		(f)	On real property which is under the control of an adult and has the permission
16			of that adult and his or her parent or legal guardian to possess a handgun; or
17		(g)	At his residence and with the permission of his <i>or her</i> parent or legal guardian
18			possesses a handgun and is justified under the principles of justification set
19			forth in KRS Chapter 503 in using physical force or deadly physical force.
20	(2)	For	the purposes of subsection (1) of this section, a handgun is "loaded" if:
21		(a)	There is a cartridge in the chamber of the handgun; [ or]
22		(b)	There is a cartridge in the cylinder of the handgun, if the handgun is a
23			revolver; <del>[ or]</del>
24		(c)	There is a cartridge in the magazine of a semiautomatic handgun, if the
25			magazine is attached to the handgun; or
26		(d)	The handgun and the ammunition for the handgun, are carried on the person
27			of one under the age of eighteen (18) years or are in such close proximity to

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- him <u>or her</u> that he <u>or she</u> could readily gain access to the handgun and the
  ammunition and load the handgun.
- 3 (3) Possession of a handgun by a minor is a <u>Class D felony</u>[Class A misdemeanor] for
- 4 the first offense and a <u>Class C[Class D]</u> felony for each subsequent offense.
