A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION establishing the DEI Economic Impact Task Force.

WHEREAS, the General Assembly has a responsibility to ensure that the spending
of tax dollars appropriated to Kentucky's public education systems is efficient, effective,
and transparent; and

6 WHEREAS, diversity, equity, and inclusion spending in Kentucky's public 7 education systems is vague and disaggregated, making the actual costs of those initiatives 8 unclear and rendering it challenging to ascertain, without further study, whether the 9 investment of task dollars towards those initiatives is yielding positive outcomes for 10 Kentucky students; and

WHEREAS, the time has come to conduct a thorough analysis of diversity, equity,
and inclusion initiatives in Kentucky's public education systems to determine their actual
costs, efficiency, effectiveness, and economic impact;

14 NOW, THEREFORE,

15 Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the General Assembly of the 16 Commonwealth of Kentucky, the Senate concurring therein:

A Section 1. The Legislative Research Commission shall establish the DEI
Economic Impact Task Force to study the current and recent use of state-appropriated
funds by Kentucky's public postsecondary education system and public school system on
diversity, equity, and inclusion initiatives to determine the actual costs, efficiency,
effectiveness, and economic impact of those initiatives.

22 → Section 2. (1) The DEI Economic Impact Task Force shall be composed of
23 the following members:

(a) Four members of the House of Representatives, including three members to
be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives and one member appointed
by the Minority Floor Leader of the House of Representatives. One of the four members
of the House of Representatives shall be designated by the Speaker of the House to serve

1 as co-chair;

(b) Four members of the Senate, including three members to be appointed by the
President of the Senate and one member to be appointed by the Minority Floor Leader of
the Senate. One of the four members of the Senate shall be designated by the President of
the Senate to serve as co-chair; and

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(c) Four stakeholders appointed by the Legislative Research Commission.

7 (2) Final membership of the task force is subject to the consideration and8 approval of the Legislative Research Commission.

9 → Section 3. The task force shall meet as necessary during the 2024 Interim of the
10 General Assembly. The task force shall submit any findings and recommendations
11 adopted by the task force to the Legislative Research Commission for referral to the
12 Interim Joint Committee on Education by December 1, 2024.

Section 4. Provisions of this Resolution to the contrary notwithstanding, the
Legislative Research Commission shall have the authority to alternatively assign the
issues identified herein to an interim joint committee or subcommittee thereof, and to
designate a study completion date.
