1	A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION relating to the establishment of the Artificial
2	Intelligence Task Force to study the impact of artificial intelligence on operation and
3	procurement policies of Kentucky government agencies and consumer protection needed
4	in private and public sectors.
5	WHEREAS, artificial intelligence is an expanding technology in both the private
6	and public sectors in Kentucky; and
7	WHEREAS, mobile users and companies are using artificial intelligence-powered
8	applications, and leading businesses are routinely investing in artificial intelligence
9	initiatives; and
10	WHEREAS, artificial intelligence involves rapidly advancing technology and
11	science to create problem-solving measures for the private and public sectors; and
12	WHEREAS, artificial intelligence has become more prevalent in individual and
13	commercial use in Kentucky, and individual companies have expressed interest in doing
14	business with Kentucky to provide services powered by artificial intelligence;
15	NOW, THEREFORE,
16	Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the General Assembly of the
17	Commonwealth of Kentucky, the Senate concurring therein:
18	→Section 1. The Legislative Research Commission is hereby directed to create
19	the Artificial Intelligence Task Force to conduct a comprehensive review of existing
20	artificial intelligence applications that would benefit Kentucky government agencies'
21	operation and procurement policies and provide recommendations on artificial
22	intelligence systems that would enhance state government operations and legislative
23	initiatives needed to provide consumer protection in the private and public sectors. The
24	Artificial Intelligence Task Force shall:
25	(1) Identify strategies by other states to study and menitor artificial intelligence

(1) Identify strategies by other states to study and monitor artificial intelligence
systems developed, employed, and procured by other states' agencies;

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(2)

Study other states' agencies currently using artificial intelligence systems in

1 government operations;

2 (3) Identify existing Kentucky agencies using artificial intelligence systems and
3 study those systems;

- 4 (4) Gather information on artificial intelligence systems used by other groups,
 5 including Kentucky businesses and the federal government; and
- 6 (5) Provide recommendations on how Kentucky government agencies use of 7 artificial intelligence systems would benefit their operation and procurement policies and 8 the legislative initiatives needed to provide consumer protection in the private and public 9 sectors to the Legislative Research Commission by December 1, 2024.
- Section 2. The Artificial Intelligence Task Force shall be composed of the
 following members, with final membership of the task force being subject to the
 consideration and approval of the Legislative Research Commission.
- (1) Four members of the House of Representatives appointed by the Speaker of
 the House of Representatives, one of whom shall be a member of the minority party, and
 one of whom shall be designated by the Speaker of the House of Representatives as a cochair of the task force; and
- 17 (2) Four members of the Senate appointed by the President of the Senate, one of
 18 whom shall be a member of the minority party, and one of whom shall be designated by
 19 the President of the Senate as a co-chair of the task force.
- Section 3. The Artificial Intelligence Task Force shall meet at least three times
 during the 2024 Interim and shall submit its findings, legislative recommendations, or a
 memorandum to the Legislative Research Commission no later than December 1, 2024. If
 legislative recommendations are submitted, the Legislative Research Commission may
 refer the recommendations to the appropriate committee or committees of jurisdiction in
 advance of the 2025 Regular Session of the Kentucky General Assembly.
- 26 → Section 4. Provisions of this Resolution to the contrary notwithstanding, the
 27 Legislative Research Commission shall have the authority to alternatively assign the

- 1 issues identified herein to an interim joint committee or subcommittee thereof, and to
- 2 designate a study completion date.
