2	to establish the Efficient and Effective School District Governance Task Force.				
3	WHEREAS, Section 183 of the Constitution of Kentucky provides that the General				
4	Assembly shall provide for an efficient system of common schools throughout the State;				
5	and				
6	WHEREAS, the General Assembly has placed high priority in ensuring students				
7	achieve at high levels; and				
8	WHEREAS, the General Assembly has the responsibility of ensuring that the state's				
9	governance models and currently established school districts are not hindering student				
10	achievement; and				
11	WHEREAS, the General Assembly recognizes that many schools in the				
12	Commonwealth have unacceptable proficiency rates in reading, writing, and				
13	mathematics, especially in school districts with an enrollment greater than 75,000				
14	students in elementary, middle, and high school; and				
15	WHEREAS, parents of students, including taxpayers, expect school districts to				
16	ensure that local policies abide by state policies and statutes; and				
17	WHEREAS, revenues and expenditures of school districts are optimized to				
18	minimize per pupil cost and maximize the highest graduation rates so that students will				
19	have the greatest opportunity to enter the workforce or obtain higher level of degrees; and				
20	WHEREAS, the General Assembly, in fulfillment of its obligations, wishes to				
21	assess the efficiency and effectiveness of the various types of schools within Kentucky's				
22	largest county school districts with student enrollment greater than 75,000 in which				
23	parents may enroll their children; and				
24	WHEREAS, the General Assembly seeks expert opinions and research from				
25	education-focused institutions such as the Pritchard Committee, the Council on				
26	Postsecondary Education, national educational research organizations, and any other				
27	organization that can provide relevant and pertinent information that pertains to school				



- 3 Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the General Assembly of the

- 5 → Section 1. The Legislative Research Commission is hereby directed to establish
- 6 the Efficient and Effective School District Governance Task Force to:
- 7 (1) Review current district governance and administration models of Kentucky's largest
- 8 county school districts with student enrollment greater than 75,000 and compare the
- 9 governance and operational structures to school districts in other states with similar
- size and demographic composition;
- 11 (2) Review publications, reports, and analyses of school governance relating to district
- size, the efficiency of districts, and the effects of size on student outcomes,
- including but not limited to a report from the Office of Education Accountability on
- school district effectiveness that was approved in the office's 2024 research agenda
- and previous Kentucky Department of Education management reports;
- 16 (3) Hear testimony from statewide education entities with experience in research on
- and expertise in education organizational structures, policies, and governance;
- 18 (4) Hear testimony from parents, teachers, school administrators, and members of
- school councils and local boards of districts with an enrollment greater than 75,000
- on the strengths and weaknesses of existing governing structures and possible
- 21 alternatives;
- 22 (5) Review relevant past performance audits, correction plans, and other analyses of
- school districts with enrollment greater than 75,000;
- 24 (6) Review how other states have implemented the creation of new school districts and

6	shall	shall be composed of the following members, with final membership of the task force				
7	being subject to the consideration and approval of the Legislative Research Commission:					
8	(1)	Two	members of the House of Representatives to be appointed by the Speaker of			
9		the I	House, one of whom shall be designated to serve as co-chair;			
10	(2)	Two	members of the Senate to be appointed by the President of the Senate, one of			
11		who	m shall be designated to serve as co-chair;			
12	(3)	One	member of the House of Representatives to be appointed by the Minority Floor			
13		Lead	der of the House;			
14	(4)	One	member of the Senate to be appointed by the Minority Floor Leader of the			
15		Sena	nte;			
16	(5)	The	State Auditor or designee;			
17	(6)	To b	be appointed by the Legislative Research Commission to ensure broad political			
18		and	geographical representation within any school district with an enrollment			
19		grea	ter than 75,000 and ensure that such appointments reflect the racial minority			
20		and	gender composition of the school districts based upon the most recent data from			
21		the U	United States Census Bureau:			
22		(a)	Two members who are taxpayers living in a school district with an enrollment			
23			greater than 75,000, who are not current employees of the school district, have			
24			competency and experience or knowledge in the field of education, and have			
25			children that are currently attending or recently graduated within the past five			
26			years from the school district;			
27		(b)	Two members with the experience in finance, management, and operations of			

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1	large businesses that operate in the Commonwealth; and
2	(c) One member who is a certified teacher currently employed as a classroom
3	teacher in a school district with enrollment greater than 75,000 who has at
4	least five years of experience working in the district; and
5	(7) The mayor or designee from the largest city located in districts with a student
6	enrollment greater than 75,000.
7	→ Section 3. The Efficient and Effective School District Governance Task Force
8	shall meet at least twice per month. The Legislative Research Commission shall assign
9	staff from the Commission or the Office of Education Accountability as necessary to
10	assist the task force to conduct its business. The Commission may also enter into
11	contracts with consultants to assist the task force in its duties.
12	→ Section 4. Provisions of this Resolution to the contrary notwithstanding, the
13	Legislative Research Commission shall have the authority to alternatively assign the
14	issues identified herein to an interim joint committee or subcommittee thereof, and to
15	designate a study completion date.
