1	A RESOLUTION recognizing May 16, 2024, and October 31, 2024, as Take Your
2	Child to Vote Day.
3	WHEREAS, May 16, 2024, is the first day of no-excuse in-person absentee voting
4	for the primary and October 31, 2024, is the first day of no-excuse in-person absentee
5	voting for the regular election; and
6	WHEREAS, voting is a vitally important element of self-governance and the
7	maintenance of a functional democracy and civil liberties; and
8	WHEREAS, the idea of government by the people, for the people, and of the people
9	has been the driving force of this country's history, with countless lives being sacrificed
10	in pursuit of this noble goal; and
11	WHEREAS, the importance of democracy can be seen in the struggle to expand
12	suffrage to historically excluded groups, such as women and racial minorities; and
13	WHEREAS, recent polls have shown younger generations are growing increasingly
14	skeptical of the democratic process; and
15	WHEREAS, these trends represent a major threat to the ideals that this country was
16	founded on, and particularly show cause for concern among younger generations; and
17	WHEREAS, in 2020, the New York Times reported that one potential reason for
18	low voter turnout for the younger generation is that they have had fewer opportunities to
19	form the habit as compared to older generations; and
20	WHEREAS, one of the best ways to foster civic virtue and appreciation for
21	democracy in youth is to expose them to the democratic process firsthand, with a clear
22	example of this being taking one's children to the voting booth; and
23	WHEREAS, people of all ages are generally influenced by what they see friends
24	and family doing; and
25	WHEREAS, taking one's children to the polls teaches them how to use their own
26	voice to stand up for what they believe in; and
27	WHEREAS, while a child may not yet understand the issues and candidates on the

ballot, teaching your child about the practice of voting is important in instilling basic
 habits of participating in the democratic process; and

3 WHEREAS, one great way to learn is by firsthand experience; and

WHEREAS, this basic fact holds true for voting as well, with a child witnessing
their parents voting leading to further interest in the democratic process and appreciation
for democracy;
