1 A RESOLUTION urging the United States Department of Labor Mine Safety and 2 Health Administration (MSHA) to adopt its proposed rule on permissible exposure limits 3 of silica dust. 4 WHEREAS, black lung disease, otherwise known as coal workers' pneumoconiosis, is a debilitating illness that causes scarred lung tissue, difficulty breathing, and other 5 6 serious and sometimes life-threatening ailments; and 7 WHEREAS, experts agree that black lung disease is largely preventable because it 8 is caused by prolonged exposure to respirable crystalline silica, also known as toxic silica 9 dust; and 10 WHEREAS, toxic silica dust is a known carcinogen the exposure to which may 11 cause several severe illnesses, including emphysema, kidney disease, and lung cancer, in 12 addition to black lung disease; and 13 WHEREAS, inhalation of toxic silica dust is a common and known occupational 14 hazard that all miners face, and the recent increase in occurrence rates of black lung 15 disease in Kentucky can be traced to higher exposure levels of toxic silica dust within 16 coal mines; and 17 WHEREAS, in 2016, the federal Occupational Safety and Health Administration 18 (OSHA) established a permissible exposure limit regulation for construction and general 19 industry; and 20 WHEREAS, MSHA has proposed a new rule to lower its existing exposure limits 21 for toxic silica dust for miners to be consistent with the OSHA 2016 final rule and with 22 the National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health recommendations; and 23 WHEREAS, the MSHA proposed rule would align mine safety standards with those 24 of other industries, protecting coal miners in the Commonwealth of Kentucky; and 25 WHEREAS, the House of Representatives acknowledges that black lung disease is 26 a devastating and debilitating disease that is currently on the rise amongst Kentucky coal 27 miners, now affecting about one-in-five coal miners, and that it is important to reduce the

2 NOW, THEREFORE,

3 Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the General Assembly of the 4 Commonwealth of Kentucky:

Section 1. The Kentucky House of Representatives urges the United States
Department of Labor Mine Safety and Health Administration to review and adopt the
proposed rule Lowering Miners' Exposure to Respirable Crystalline Silica and Improving
Respiratory Protection, 88 Fed. Reg. 44,852 (July 13, 2023).

Section 2. The Clerk of the House of Representatives is directed to transmit a
copy of this Resolution and notification of its adoption to the Secretary of Labor at the
United States Department of Labor, the Director of the Office of Standards, Regulations,
and Variances at the Mine Safety and Health Administration, the Speaker of the United
States House of Representatives, the Majority Leader of the United States Senate, and
Kentucky's Congressional delegation.
