1	A RESOLUTION expressing concern about federal regulatory overreach on the
2	chemical industry.
3	WHEREAS, the Commonwealth of Kentucky recognizes the vital role played by
4	the chemical industry in the economic development, national security, and technological
5	innovation of the United States; and
6	WHEREAS, the chemical industry is a cornerstone of our nation's economy,
7	contributing over \$600 billion in economic impact, supporting more than half a million
8	jobs, and constituting 25 percent of the nation's gross domestic product; and
9	WHEREAS, the chemical industry is instrumental in providing essential products
10	and innovations that drive progress in areas such as housing, infrastructure, healthcare,
11	telecommunications, and clean energy solutions; and
12	WHEREAS, the success of the chemical industry is crucial to maintaining the
13	United States' global competitiveness and achieving national priorities; and
14	WHEREAS, recent regulatory actions and proposed restrictions by the federal
15	government have raised concerns about the impact on the chemical industry's ability to
16	innovate, create products, and contribute to the nation's economic growth; and
17	WHEREAS, these new restrictions have the potential to limit access to and increase
18	the cost of essential products, which would negatively impact the United States economy,
19	jeopardize American competitiveness, and delay progress in industries with urgent and
20	growing needs; and
21	WHEREAS, there are currently 13 proposed new restrictions with the potential to
22	directly impact the chemical industry, ranging from outright bans on certain chemistries
23	to regulations that may render manufacturing unviable or impossible; and
24	WHEREAS, these restrictions may have detrimental effects on the supply chains
25	for vital technologies, including semiconductors, electric vehicles, and modern healthcare
26	applications; and
27	WHEREAS, the proposed restrictions contradict policy priorities set forth by laws

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such as the Inflation Reduction Act of 2022, Pub. L. No. 117-169, the Infrastructure

- 2 Investment and Jobs Act, Pub. L. No. 117-58, and the CHIPS Act of 2022, Pub. L. No.
- 3 117-167; and
- 4 WHEREAS, responsible regulation that prioritizes science, promotes innovation,
- 5 and supports supply chain resiliency is essential to achieving national goals;
- 6 NOW, THEREFORE,
- 7 Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the General Assembly of the
- 8 Commonwealth of Kentucky:
- 9 → Section 1. The House of Representatives expresses concern about the potential
- adverse impact of regulatory overreach on the chemical industry and its contributions to
- 11 the nation's economic prosperity.
- → Section 2. The House of Representatives calls on the federal executive
- administration, federal agencies, and Congress to reevaluate proposed restrictions on the
- 14 chemical industry, ensuring that regulations are based on sound science, promote
- innovation, and support supply chain resiliency.
- → Section 3. The House of Representatives urges the federal executive
- 17 administration, federal agencies, and Congress to support frameworks that celebrate
- innovation and accelerate progress in the chemical industry.
- → Section 4. The Clerk of the House of Representatives shall transmit copies of
- 20 this Resolution and notification of its adoption to the President of the United States, the
- 21 Kentucky congressional delegation, and the administrator of the United States
- 22 Environmental Protection Agency to inform them of the concerns and recommendations
- 23 expressed herein.

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
