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1	AN ACT relating to discriminatory practices by state agencies.
2	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:
3	→SECTION 1. A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 344 IS CREATED TO
4	READ AS FOLLOWS:
5	(1) As used in this section:
6	(a) "Computer" means an electronic device that has the ability to store,
7	retrieve, or process information;
8	(b) ''Digital identification'' means any electronic process, procedure, or
9	documentation used to verify an individual's name, likeness, or other traits
10	unique to the individual;
11	(c) "Mobile device" means a portable device that has the capability to connect
12	to the internet or communicate with other cellular devices;
13	(d) "Resident of the Commonwealth" means:
14	<b><u>1.</u></b> An individual residing in the Commonwealth;
15	2. A domestic business entity with a location in the Commonwealth;
16	3. A foreign business entity registered with the Secretary of State;
17	4. An individual that is employed and works at a location or locations
18	within the Commonwealth;
19	5. An individual or business entity that owns real property within the
20	<u>Commonwealth; or</u>
21	6. Any individual or business entity that has been authorized to act on
22	behalf of an individual or business entity defined in subparagraphs 1.
23	to 5. of this paragraph; and
24	(e) ''State agency'' means any department, commission, council, board, bureau,
25	committee, institution, legislative body, agency, government corporation, or
26	other entity of the executive, judicial, or legislative branch of the state
27	government.

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1	(2) It is an unlawful practice for a state agency within the Commonwealth to:
2	(a) Require a resident of the Commonwealth to own, operate, or communicate
3	with any state agency using a mobile device, computer, or digital
4	identification in order to receive benefits or entitlements for which the
5	person would otherwise be eligible. An alternate method of communication
6	or validation shall be provided by the state agency;
7	(b) Deny a resident of the Commonwealth access to any state building, agency,
8	or department of the state that is responsible for providing benefits or
9	entitlements based on ownership of a mobile device, computer, or digital
10	identification. An alternate method of access shall be provided by the state
11	<u>agency;</u>
12	(c) Deny access to a court hearing based on ownership of a mobile device,
13	computer, or digital identification. An alternate method of access shall be
14	provided by the state agency;
15	(d) Exclude a person from receiving benefits or entitlements for which he or
16	she would otherwise be eligible based on ownership of a mobile device,
17	computer, or digital identification. An alternate method of receipt of
18	benefits shall be provided by the state agency; or
19	(e) Require exclusively credit or other electronic payment methods. A method
20	of accepting cash payments shall be required.
21	Section 2. This Act may be cited as the Digital Identification Act.
