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1	AN ACT relating to automated license plate readers.
2	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:
3	→ SECTION 1. A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 189 IS CREATED TO
4	READ AS FOLLOWS:
5	(1) As used in this section:
6	(a) "Automated license plate reader" or "ALPR" means a system of one (1) or
7	more mobile or fixed high-speed cameras combined with computer
8	algorithms to convert images of license plates into data that is readable by a
9	<u>computer system;</u>
10	(b) "Entity" means any owner or operator of an ALPR that shares the data
11	collected by the ALPR with any public agency or law enforcement agency;
12	and
13	(c) ''Public agency'' has the same meaning as in KRS 61.870.
14	(2) An ALPR may only be utilized by an entity for:
15	(a) Criminal investigations within established constitutional parameters
16	pursuant to:
17	1. A search warrant issued by a court of this Commonwealth;
18	2. A federal search warrant issued in compliance with the Federal Rules
19	of Criminal or Civil Procedure; or
20	3. The required retention of evidence related to a criminal charge or
21	complaint until the criminal charge or complaint is resolved or
22	<u>dismissed;</u>
23	(b) Commercial trucking requirements; or
24	(c) The sole purpose of toll collection identification on highways and bridges by
25	the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet and shall not include any tracking or
26	movement toward locations of any vehicle identified.
27	(3) An ALPR shall not be capable of photographing, recording, or producing images

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1	of the occupants of a vehicl	<u>2.</u>
2	(4) Data collected by an ALPR	shall be limited to the following:
3	(a) License plate numbers	<u>.</u>
4	(b) Date, time, and location	n data on vehicles; and
5	(c) Pictures of license pla	tes, vehicles, and areas surrounding the vehicles.
6	(5) (a) A positive match by a	n ALPR device alone shall not constitute reasonable
7	suspicion or grounds	for a law enforcement officer to stop any vehicle.
8	(b) A law enforcement off	icer shall:
9	<u>1. Develop indeper</u>	ndent reasonable suspicion for any vehicle stop or
10	immediately visi	ually confirm that the license plate on the vehicle
11	matches the image	ge of the license plate displayed on the ALPR; and
12	2. Confirm by othe	r means that the license plate number is related to a
13	<u>vehicle subject to</u>	the criteria in subsection (2) of this section.
14	(6) An ALPR shall not be used	to monitor or track an individual unless:
15	(a) Authorized by a warr	ant, issued by a court of competent jurisdiction upon
16	probable cause; or	
17	(b) Otherwise constitution	nally permitted without obtaining a warrant under
18	exigent circumstances	<u>.</u>
19	(7) License plate data not mee	ting the criteria established in subsection (2) of this
20	section shall be automatical	ly deleted or overwritten within three (3) minutes, and
21	<u>a log of any data or info</u>	mation captured that does not meet the criteria in
22	subsection (2) of this section	n shall not be created.
23	(8) (a) An entity shall not	
24	<u>1. Sell any record</u>	ed images or data captured by an ALPR for any
25	<u>purpose;</u>	
26	2. Collect or store	data that could be used for any purpose not listed in
27	subsection (2) of	this section; or

1	3. Make any data collected by an ALPR available to any person or entity
2	other than the party whose data has been collected except by an order
3	of a court of competent jurisdiction.
4	(b) If data is collected by the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet under
5	subsection (2) of this section, the cabinet shall ensure that the data is not
6	released to any other entity or person except for toll collection purposes in a
7	civil collection or enforcement proceeding, and under no circumstances
8	shall the data identify any movement of a vehicle toward any specific
9	location.
10	(9) Any entity that collects data by an ALPR shall:
11	(a) Adopt and publicize a written policy governing the collection and use of
12	data captured by an ALPR that shall include:
13	1. Identification of the database used to compare data obtained by the
14	<u>ALPR;</u>
15	2. Retention and destruction of data associated with the ALPR;
16	3. Authorized release of data associated with the ALPR;
17	4. Training of ALPR system operators;
18	5. Supervisory oversight of ALPR use;
19	6. Access to and security of data;
20	7. The position classification of personnel authorized to query data
21	captured by an ALPR;
22	8. Safeguards to ensure that personnel with access to the ALPR database
23	are adequately screened and trained; and
24	9. Any other subjects or areas related to ALPR use;
25	(b) Maintain a log of its use including:
26	<b>1.</b> The aggregate number of vehicles or license plates on which data was
27	collected for each period of active use and a list of all state and federal

1	databases with which the data was compared;
2	2. The location at which the ALPR that actively collected the data was
3	installed and used;
4	3. A record of users who access ALPR data which shall be maintained
5	indefinitely;
6	4. System maintenance and calibration records; and
7	5. The number of ALPR disclosures, including the entity or person to
8	which or to whom the data was disclosed, the purpose of the
9	disclosure, and the authority for the disclosure; and
10	(c) Develop an audit process to:
11	1. Ensure that information obtained through an ALPR system is used
12	only for authorized purposes of the entity;
13	2. Determine the effectiveness of the system; and
14	3. At least once every year:
15	a. Audit its ALPR system use and effectiveness, and report the
16	findings to the head of the entity responsible for operating the
17	system; and
18	b. Report the log information required in paragraph (b) of this
19	subsection to the Department of Kentucky State Police.
20	(10) The Department of Kentucky State Police shall promulgate administrative
21	regulations in accordance with KRS Chapter 13A to establish an annual review
22	process for any entity that utilizes an ALPR, to ensure that information obtained
23	through the use of ALPR systems is used only for the purposes permitted by this
24	section, and the department shall review all information submitted under
25	subsection (9) of this section to verify compliance with the requirements of this
26	section.
