1	A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION urging Congress to repeal the REAL ID Act of
2	2005.
3	WHEREAS, the people of the Commonwealth recognize the Constitution of the
4	United States as our charter of liberty and that the Bill of Rights enshrines the
5	fundamental and inalienable rights of Americans, including the right to privacy; and
6	WHEREAS, it is the duty, and the privilege, of the elected representatives of the
7	people of the Commonwealth to ensure that their interest in privacy is zealously
8	safeguarded; and
9	WHEREAS, the Commonwealth has continually shown its hesitancy to comply
10	with participation and implementation of the federal REAL ID Act of 2005, as one of the
11	last states to start issuing REAL ID cards; and
12	WHEREAS, the REAL ID Act of 2005 mandates an unfunded national
13	identification card on the people of the Commonwealth and was passed without a public
14	hearing or careful deliberation by the federal government without any regard for the
15	sanctity of states' rights; and
16	WHEREAS, residents of the Commonwealth have spent \$7,090,232 on
17	identification cards that are compliant with the REAL ID Act of 2005; and
18	WHEREAS, fewer than 18.2% of citizens of the Commonwealth have chosen a
19	state identification card that is compliant with the REAL ID Act of 2005; and
20	WHEREAS, the REAL ID Act of 2005 national database invites the theft of
21	identity and invasion of privacy of all those who hold conforming identification cards;
22	and
23	WHEREAS, the REAL ID Act of 2005 national database would facilitate the
24	tracking of data on individuals by federal and state governments; and
25	WHEREAS, the REAL ID Act of 2005 is an affront to the concept of federalism
26	enshrined in the Tenth Amendment of the United States Constitution; and
27	WHEREAS, implementation of the REAL ID Act of 2005 has proved so unwieldy

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- and difficult that the federal government has been obligated, multiple times, to delay its
- 2 full implementation of the law, most recently until May 7, 2025, nearly 20 years after its
- 3 passage;
- 4 NOW, THEREFORE,
- 5 Be it resolved by the Senate of the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of
- 6 Kentucky, the House of Representatives concurring therein:
- 7 → Section 1. The Kentucky General Assembly respectfully urges and requests that
- 8 the Congress of the United States repeal the REAL ID Act of 2005.
- 9 → Section 2. The Clerk of the Senate shall send copies of this Concurrent
- 10 Resolution to the Clerk of the House of Representatives of the United States, the
- 11 Secretary of the Senate of the United States, and each member of the Kentucky
- 12 congressional delegation.
