A RESOLUTION honoring and commending the Louisville Fire Department
 firefighters, Louisville Metro Police Department officers, and Louisville emergency
 medical services personnel involved in the recent rescue on the Clark Memorial Bridge.

WHEREAS, at around noon on Friday, March 1, 2024, a multi-vehicle collision
involving two passenger vehicles, a pickup truck, and a semitruck occurred on the Clark
Memorial Bridge, which spans the Ohio River and connects Louisville, Kentucky, and
Jeffersonville, Indiana; and

8 WHEREAS, the end result of the chain-reaction accident was the semitruck going 9 through the guardrails and partially off the bridge, with half the vehicle hanging off the 10 bridge and the cab of the vehicle dangling precipitously some 60 feet above the Ohio 11 River; and

WHEREAS, responding with lighting speed, a Louisville Fire Department rescue squad arrived at the accident site and hooked Firefighter Bryce Carden into a harness from a ladder truck to reach the semi's driver, secure her, and lift her back onto the bridge, less than an hour after the accident occurred; and

WHEREAS, although he is being hailed as a hero, Bryce Carden is quick to recognize the entire team for their part in the rescue, stating, "Like I was telling chief. It all goes back to training we've done this probably 100 times. We have good leaders that have taught how to take care of the site situation."; and

Be it resolved by the Senate of the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:

their continued safety.
