A RESOLUTION commemorating and honoring the life and accomplishments of Dr. J. W. Patterson.

WHEREAS, Dr. J. W. Patterson was a native of Oklahoma who taught at
Muskogee Central High School before earning graduate degrees from the University of
Michigan and the University of Oklahoma; and

6 WHEREAS, Dr. J. W. Patterson joined the University of Kentucky's Department of 7 Communication in 1960; and

8 WHEREAS, Dr. J. W. Patterson served as University of Kentucky's debate team 9 director from 1971 until his retirement in 2009. During his tenure, he led the university 10 debate team to numerous achievements, becoming one of the most dominant teams in the 11 country; and

WHEREAS, while serving as director, Dr. J. W. Patterson founded several debate tournaments and organizations, including the Tournament of Champions, the Kentucky High School Debate Institute, and the Henry Clay College Debate Tournament. The Tournament of Champions is a national high school speech and debate tournament that occurs in Lexington, Kentucky, each April, and it has served to open the world of debate to children across the country; and

WHEREAS, under Dr. J. W. Patterson's tutelage, the University of Kentucky debate team sent 21 first-round teams to the National Debate Tournament and had six top speakers at the tournament, the second-highest number of all time. The team won the national championship in 1986, was runner-up in 2002, and won a Copeland Award, given to the top-ranked team in the nation, in 1994; and

WHEREAS, for six decades, Dr. J. W. Patterson dedicated himself to teaching high school and college students across the country. Dr. Patterson believed in the value of debate, stating that "the mastery of debating both sides of any important topic creates an understanding that truths always exist on all sides of every major issue"; and

WHEREAS, Dr. J. W. Patterson served as a special assistant to University of

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Kentucky president John Oswald and directed the University of Kentucky's 100th
 birthday celebration, which included more than 100 events throughout the year and a
 Founder's Day visit from President Lyndon B. Johnson; and

WHEREAS, Dr. J. W. Patterson passed away peacefully in December 2023 after a
life of innumerable achievements; and

6 WHEREAS, David Arnett, director of UK Debate, said, "It is fair to say that no one 7 has ever had a bigger footprint on the world of speech and debate. Dr. Patterson's legacy 8 spans generations and has touched the lives of thousands. He was as elite debate coach, a 9 passionate educator, and the brilliant architect of what would become the modern 10 competitive debate ecosystem in this country. What I will remember him for most 11 though, is his love of friends and community";
